Chris's Testimony:

When I was preparing for release from prison, I had nowhere to go—returning home wasn't an option, and it would have been a rough start. I believe God orchestrated my arrival at Euthus House; everything aligned so perfectly that I had no doubts it was His plan. I desperately needed the guidance and support here, and it has been an incredible blessing. I was baptized on December 7, 2025, at Wasilla Bible Church, publicly declaring my faith in Jesus Christ—the Messiah who died for my sins and rose again.

Looking back, I see God's hand protecting me throughout my life, often sparing me from far worse outcomes. My arrest and incarceration hit at just the right moment, shaking me awake to my lack of control and the disaster my path was heading toward. These lessons have shown me that God alone is truly dependable—without Him, I am lost.

Ian's Testimony:

In 2017, I was arrested in Kodiak and sentenced to three years in prison. During that time, though I didn't fully recognize it then, I experienced a complete surrender to Christ. My original plan was to return to Kodiak upon release, but God had a different path for me—He led me to Euthus House. Here, I was provided with every resource I needed to build stability: structure, mentoring, accountability, and practical support for reentry. Most importantly, Christ is at the center of everything at Euthus House, and that has made all the difference in my transformation. I am deeply grateful to my mentors and the board members for allowing God to use them in this vital ministry. Thank you for being part of the work that changes lives through His grace.

No agenda, no to-do list—just laughter, bad singing, maybe a goofy story or two, and a reminder that amid all the logistics, God’s still in the business of marking another year of life transformed. TAKING CARE OF OUR #2 PRIORITIES

Euthus House recently learned a valuable life lesson: sometimes “character-building” doesn’t come from workshops or group meetings—it comes from a \$30,000 septic system replacement.

What began as a perfectly normal week quickly turned into an all-hands-on-deck infrastructure adventure. Experts were summoned, holes were dug, terms like lateral lines and tank capacity were thrown around with alarming confidence, and suddenly everyone had a crash course in why modern plumbing deserves daily gratitude.

The good news? In a feat of coordination that deserves its own commemorative plaque, the entire system was replaced in just a couple of days. No lingering chaos, no extended disruption—just swift action, deep breaths, and a lighter bank account.


CAPTIAL CAMPAIGN

Euthus House is bursting at the seams. We have 17 beds filled and are still turning away men every week—men fresh out of incarceration or substance abuse treatment. Men desperate for the structured, Christ-centered reentry support that could change their lives forever. We simply don't have the beds, the space, or the resources to say “yes” to everyone God brings to our door. That's why we are launching our capital campaign: to pay off our current facility and pursue building a new facility, adding more rooms, essential systems, and opening our doors wider. Your partnership will help us reach more brothers in need, giving them the discipleship, mentoring, accountability, and the hope they need to rebuild productive, faith-filled lives. Every gift moves us closer to turning “no room” into “welcome home.”

Our 92% success rate for men who complete our program demonstrates the power of combining Christ-centered living with real-world preparation. Euthus House is one of the few programs in Alaska making significant headway in breaking cycles of addiction and recidivism.

Markers for success include:

- Completion of the program
- No re-incarceration
- Stable housing
- Stable employment
- Maintaining sobriety

SECURE OUR FACILITY AND EXPAND

To continue and grow this life-changing work, we must own our current facility outright. Our property is appraised at \$900,000. Money from our general fund and finances already pledged for this project cover 80% of the need. Raising the remaining \$270,000 will fully pay off the property, freeing resources for our next vision: building an on-site additional facility to serve more men and deepen our impact in the Mat-Su community.


WELCOME KITS

That's why we're putting together simple **WELCOME KITS** filled with essential personal care and comfort items to help them feel seen, cared for, and ready to begin a new chapter with dignity and peace.

These bags include basics like toiletries, comfortable socks, underwear, a few hygiene essentials, and small comforts that make their space feel more like home right away. Your support in helping us stock these kits means every new brother starts feeling the love and grace of this community from day one. -WELCOME KITS- **NEW ITEMS NEEDED FOR MEN INCLUDE**

- Ditty Bags (toiletry bags)
- Razors (disposable)
- Toothbrushes (adult)
- Toothpaste (travel/full-size tubes)
- Bath Soap (bar or body wash)
- Shampoo
- Towels (bath towels & washcloths)
- Deodorant (stick or roll-on)
- Laundry Soap
- Pillows (standard size)
- Twin Sheets (fitted sheets, flat sheets, pillowcases)
- Twin Blankets/Comforters
- Socks (crew or ankle socks - up to size 12)
- Underwear (briefs or boxers - large or XL)



These items address immediate hygiene, comfort, and basic needs upon arrival. Quantities can vary based on donations, but aim for individually packaged and new items for hygiene reasons. Thank you for helping support the men at Euthus House as they rebuild their lives!
