Part I begins with Isaiah's message of comfort to God's people and what would become John the Baptist's cry, quoting Isaiah, to "*prepare the way of the Lord*" (Isaiah 40:3, cited in Mark 1:3). He is coming, but his people and his path must be prepared. This leads directly into the Old Testament prophecies of God's coming as Immanuel to comfort and be with his people - but also to judge, purge, and refine them. These prophecies are then fulfilled in Luke's narrative of Jesus's birth and the praise of the angelic chorus, followed by more Isaianic prophecies that tell of Jesus's earthly ministry - of His healing miracles, His works of deliverance, His preaching "*peace to the heathen*," and His offering rest for the heavy laden.

PEACE

Second Sunday of Advent

The second advent candle, also known as **"The Bethlehem Candle"** represents **Peace**.

Peace is a central theme of the Advent season but the main focus of the second week of Advent. One of the prophecies about Jesus calls him **"the Prince of Peace"** (Isaiah 9:6-7). When the angels appeared to the shepherds, they ended their message by saying, *"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favour rests"* (Luke 2:14). When Simeon saw baby Jesus in the temple, he thanked God that he could now die in peace for he had seen the Messiah (Luke 2:29-33). On a broader level, the Bible talks in various places about a spiritual war going on between goodness and evil (or "powers and principalities" (Ephesians 6:12). The combination of Satan fighting against goodness and humans fighting against God has made the earth a battleground in an ongoing fight.

Much has been said about how the Israelites were expecting the Messiah to be a saviour who rescued them from the Romans. If that were the case, the Messiah would bring peace by ending the reign of oppression and the string of failed rebellions. He would return Israel to its former national glory.

Jesus talked about peace on several occasions. During the Sermon on the Mount, he taught that peacemakers are blessed and will be called God's sons (Matthew 5:9). At the same time, he warned his disciples that he had not come to bring peace to the world, that in fact, he would divide people (Matthew 10:34-36). Then, at the Last Supper, as he told his disciples that he would leave them soon, Jesus comforted them by saying, *"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid"* (John 14:27). Clearly, the peace that Jesus offered was not typical.

"A Time For Re-Centring"

In this week's reading, wild-eyed John the Baptist stands on the edge of the wilderness and calls the people to attention. He warns them about the pull of their own times - the temptation to believe they can enjoy the riches of Caesar's kingdoms and the glittering pleasures of the empire while still claiming to live as God's faithful. John won't let them settle for that illusion. He protests with a fierce honesty, naming them a brood of vipers who are trying to escape the hard but necessary work of preparing the world for God's arrival.



"Repent!" he cries, urging them to turn around, to set their lives to a different rhythm. Follow a different drummer, he insists - follow him into the wilderness path, and follow the One who is coming, the One who will gather, refine, and renew.

John reminds us, as he does every Advent, that getting to Christmas is not as simple as lighting candles and counting days. It's a journey of real change, real courage, and real preparation for the Holy One who draws near.

ADVENT PROJECT 2025

Outreach Committee

“GREEN INGLU” is a Canadian organization that supplies growing domes for Indigenous communities living in remote areas, including the Arctic.

Every **Advent**, the **Outreach Committee** chooses an **Advent Project** for our congregation. Through the years, we have partnered with many organizations through our **Advent Projects**.

This year, the **Outreach Committee** decided on a year long focus on Indigenous communities, their challenges and their successes. This fall, our focus is on **Food Insecurity** among Indigenous peoples. Recently we showed a film called **“A Right To Eat”**. We learned that in remote areas where Indigenous peoples live, fresh food has to be flown in at great cost. The lack of affordable, fresh fruit and vegetables is contributing to health problems, including heart disease and a very high rate of diabetes.

GREEN IGLU is an organization helping to address this problem, by providing “growing domes” in which vegetables and herbs will grow

beyond the short growing season of the northern climate. And the produce is grown vertically to produce a larger harvest.

We are excited to be a part of the solution to **Food Insecurity** of Indigenous communities. Let’s make a difference and support this creative solution. 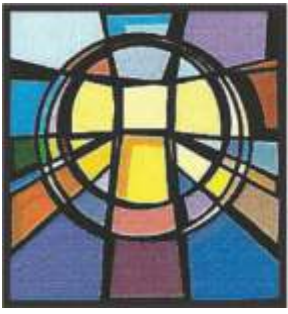
