# My Mother

I learned a song in Grade 1 called "My Mother", which I always sung to my mother. Over the years I had forgotten some of the lyrics but thanks to the internet and Google, I found that it is actually a poem written by the English poet and literary critic, Ann Taylor, later Gilbert, together with her sister, Jane Taylor.



We did not use to have Mother's Day in the Philippines, but we celebrated "Family Day" instead around November or December. For such occasion, the school provided us with carnation flowers for us to give to our mothers or to pin on our school uniforms. Deep red carnation meant your mother was still living. White carnation meant your mother had passed. As the teacher handed us the flowers, I asked for a white one. She was quite confused and was about to scold me so I told her that my mother disliked red flowers, especially the deep red ones as she seemed to associate them with something morbid, like funeral wreaths. I will then give her the white carnation because white signifies purity and that mother's love is pure.

When I got home, I gave the white carnation to my mother. "Do you think or do you want me dead?" she asked. So I gave

her the same spiel I gave the teacher, that white means purity and a mother's love is pure. She then took the flower, put it in an empty bottle with water, while giving me a look that seemed to say "Where in heaven's name do you learn these things?" But of course, it was no surprise to her - despite having finished only grade 3, she taught me and my siblings how to write and read, in English, long before we started schooling.

**Ann Taylor (1783 -1866) was a poet and literary critic. Born in England to a successful and well-educated family, she and her sister Jane, who is best known for the classic children's verse, "Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star," wrote a number of children's books. Ann also wrote a number of hymns. A devoted advocate of animal welfare, Ann also took an active interest in social issues. Widowed in her late sixties, she wrote prolifically and travelled extensively until her death.)**

On Mother's Day, we give thanks for mothers and for all those who carry a mother's love. Those who nurture, protect, and keep going through great responsibility, often while carrying more than they can easily name.

In January 2025, in the Eastern Carpathian Mountains of Ukraine, a retreat in Tukhlyra offered mothers and children a chance to step away from the pressures of daily survival and receive care. Through **ACT Alliance**, **ACT** member **Hungarian Interchurch Aid** welcomed families who had been displaced by war or were living near the frontlines into a space of rest and support.

**The Prime Minister, Mark Carney, announced that, on his recommendation, His Majesty King Charles III has approved the appointment of the Honourable Louise Arbour as the next Governor General of Canada.**

As Governor General, Ms. Arbour will be the representative of His Majesty The King in Canada. She will be Canada's 31st Governor General since Confederation and the first Governor General of Canada appointed by His Majesty.

Ms. Arbour is a world-renowned legal scholar, judge, and leader in human rights and justice. With a career of service spanning more than five decades, she has held nearly every office a Canadian jurist can hold, and several that no Canadian had held before. She was appointed as a judge to the **Supreme Court of Ontario**, the **Court of Appeal for Ontario**, and the **Supreme Court of Canada**. In 1996, she was appointed by the **United Nations (UN)** as **Chief Prosecutor for the International Criminal Tribunals** for the former Yugoslavia and for Rwanda. In this role, she led efforts that resulted in the first conviction for genocide since the **Genocide Convention** and the first indictment for war crimes of a sitting head of state.



*Louise Arbour*

Ms. Arbour was appointed **High Commissioner for Human Rights** by the UN Secretary-General in 2004 and later served as **UN Special Representative for International Migration** from 2017 to 2018. More recently, she delivered the **Independent External Comprehensive Review** on misconduct in the **Canadian Armed Forces**, which became a catalyst for unprecedented culture change and reform.

Ms. Arbour is a **Companion of the Order of Canada**, Canada's highest civilian honour, and a **Grande officière de l'Ordre national du Québec**. She has received nearly 100 honours and awards, including 42 honorary doctorates from universities around the world. Ms. Arbour's experience, judgement, moral clarity, and conviction will serve Canada exceedingly well.

Ms. Arbour's term begins on June 8, 2026 and runs for five years.

The idea that healthy societies need to be governed by rules and principles that are fair, transparent, accessible and universal is referred to as the "rule of law", and it is a fundamental cornerstone of democracy in Canada. Yet increasingly, people in Canada are observing a decline in the health of our democracy. Examples like increasing use of the Notwithstanding Clause to circumvent Charter rights and avoid the scrutiny of the courts, threats to judicial independence, and enacting legislation that permits governments to bypass other legal protections point to what many call "democratic backsliding" - governments that are less transparent, less accountable and accessible to the people they serve.

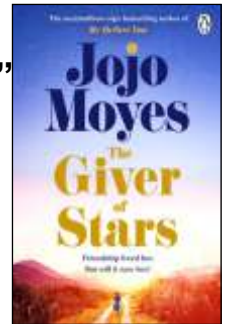
