"Do Not Be Weary"

A new heaven and a new earth...wars and persecutions...at first glance, they don't seem to belong together. What were the lectionary folks thinking? These seemingly contradictory passages we will hear this week invite us into the tension of endings and beginnings - the vision of what is yet to come, the promise of what can and will be. They speak of times of trial and times of peace. It was the best of times; it was the worst of times.

This is the contradiction we live in every day. We are caught between despair and hope, between those who urge us to be realistic and the deep, restless stirring of our vision for a better life. We are caught between voices that declare the world is falling apart and those who imagine a different

reality - a life renewed, whole, and just, a life that can come to be, will come to be, if we only trust in the promises of God and live faithfully into them. In these passages, we are reminded that faith does not deny the brokenness of our world; it names it, sits with it, and yet dares to envision a new creation rising out of it - a life redeemed, a world restored.

So the question for us today is this: will we live as if that new creation is already breaking into our world?

World Children's Day November 20, 2025

For every child, every right.

"On World Children's Day, we celebrate the youngest members of our human family. But today is also a moment to recognize the enormous challenges children face in our deeply divided, tumultuous and often violent world.

UN Secretary-General António Guterres

World Children's Day was first established in 1954 as Universal Children's Day and is celebrated on 20 November each year to promote international togetherness, awareness among children worldwide, and improving children's welfare.

November 20th is an important date as it is the date in 1959 when the UN General Assembly adopted the *Declaration of the Rights of the Child*. It is also the date in 1989 when the UN General Assembly adopted the *Convention on the Rights of the Child*.

Mothers and fathers, teachers, nurses and doctors, government leaders and civil society activists, religious and community elders, corporate moguls and media professionals, as well as young people and children themselves, can play an important part in making **World Children's Day** relevant for their societies, communities and nations.

World Children's Day offers each of us an inspirational entry-point to advocate, promote and celebrate children's rights, translating into dialogues and actions that will build a better world for children.

"Child rights are human rights. They are non-negotiable. But in too many places today children's rights are being misunderstood, disregarded, or even denied and attacked. World leaders must uphold their obligations under the Convention on the Rights of the Child and respect, protect and fulfill the rights of every child, everywhere.

Investing in children today secures a better future for them, and us all.

World Children's Day provides an opportunity to focus on the issues that matter most to children.

There are few images more heart-rending than that of a girl or boy who is forced to work or is denied the opportunity to go to school.

Despite increasing global recognition of the rights of the child, there are currently approximately 168 million children between the ages 5 and 17 who are engaged in child labour.

This accounts for almost 11% of the child population as a whole.

Children in hazardous work make up almost half of all child labourers numbering 85 million (55 million boys and 30 million girls) and this number is used as an estimate of the number of children in "the worst forms of child labour."

Becoming a new parent can be overwhelming, with the constant demands of caring for a newborn, sleepless nights, and the pressure to make the right choices for your child. The exhaustion of balancing daily responsibilities while navigating the unknowns of parenthood often leaves new parents feeling unsure and isolated. It's a time filled with great joy, but also uncertainty, as parents adjust to their new roles and work to create a safe and nurturing environment for their little one.

At **Fairview Resource Centre** in Halifax, Nova Scotia, the **New Parents Support** group aims to walk with parents as they navigate the complexities of raising a newborn. Once a week, parents gather to meet with a public health nurse who provides education and answers questions. From expectant parents to those with babies up to 18 months, the program provides resources for those who might not otherwise have access to in-person support or resources.

Parents connect not only with health professionals, but form deep bonds with each other, and some are still in contact many years later. Many of us have heard that "it takes a village to raise a child," and Fairview Resource Centre is truly taking action to give a positive space for children in the community to flourish. Thank you for walking alongside our Mission and Service partners as they help children and communities grow.








The Victorian Cult of Mourning


Make a Will

Note, this program is for general information only, not for drafting individual wills.


