JOIN US THIS SUNDAY

Joel chapter 2: verses 23 ~ 32 Luke chapter 18: verses 9 ~ 14

"God, You There?"

The passage from Luke for this Sunday features a story that Jesus told about a Pharisee and a Tax Collector who went to the Temple to pray. Two characters that are polar opposites.



The Pharisee was religiously righteous, the tax man extorted revenue for the Roman oppressors. The religious expert was smug and confident, the outsider was anxious and insecure. The Pharisee paraded around telling God how good he was and how valuable he was to God. The Tax Collector hung his head standing at a distance and begged God for forgiveness. He could not even look up when he considered what a sinner he was.

The parable punch line announces a reversal in the end. The respectable, reputable Pharisee, so competent and accomplished, the one who had done everything right was rejected. Whereas the disreputable, inadequate Tax Collector went away "justified" because of his humility.

This year, our focus will be on Indigenous peoples in Canada. Their challenges are many but we decided that we would zero in on *FOOD INSECURITY* and *FOOD SOVEREIGNTY*, because nutritious, affordable food, or the lack of it, affects physical and mental health, family and community relationships, education and so much more.

Learning about Indigenous culture, their challenges and their successes are an important step towards reconciliation.

Therefore, the *Outreach Committee* would like to invite you to join us for a learning event on Saturday November 15th, 12 ~ 2 pm in the *Living Room*, where together we will explore and learn about some of the challenges that Indigenous peoples face around *Food*

Insecurity and Food Sovereignty.

We will also see video clips of two inspiring solutions that are already being practiced in their communities.

A Right to Eat will be shown as we eat lunch (sandwiches, an Indigenous salad, cookies, tea and coffee)

This inner tranquility is not simply silence, but an attitude of listening and openness towards God.

PEACE IS THE MISSION OF GOD'S PEOPLE

Doing justice, loving one another as Christ loves us, and working for peace are central to the mission of God's people in the world: What does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God? (Micah 6:8)

Principles of Peace

PEACE AND THE CHURCH

The church proclaims the presence of God's Kingdom to the World. The church sacramentally restores humanity's relationship with God, with each other, and with creation. The healing, restoration and salvation of God's creation is the church's first priority and obligation. Peacebuilding and justice making are necessary and indivisible imperatives that guide the church's thinking and action.

FOOD GLORIOUS FOOD!!!! As Thanksgiving approaches, we think of food and the bountiful harvest from our Canadian earth......apples, potatoes, corn, brussel sprouts, squash, pumpkins,.....which will grace our Thanksgiving tables. Unfortunately, many families are challenged with food insecurity, made worse by recent economic factors. Some facts about the **Community Share Food Bank** from their website:



Community Share provides a three-day supply of food, twice per month, to individuals and families who live within our catchment area. We serve the area between Bayview Avenue east to Victoria Park and 401 south to Eglinton Avenue.



Participants can choose non-perishable items in a market-style model. Through the support of our donors, hampers always feature fresh produce, milk, eggs and bread.



They offer a delivery program to participants who are unable to come to the food bank in person; they may apply to have a hamper delivered right to their door.



Community Share currently offers a referral service for participants who would like to be connected to other social services within the GTA.



In 2013, Community Share and Overland Learning Centre partnered to create the Overland Environmental Learning Garden (OELG), located next door to the food bank on Toronto District School Board property. The garden provides an outdoor educational space for adult ESL learners, as well as fresh produce for our food hampers and kitchen programs.



Many people who used to donate to the food bank are now having to receive food from the food bank

This is our annual **THANKSGIVING FOOD DRIVE**, and so we are inviting **DCUC** to financially support our local **Community Share Food Bank**. We know many congregants give to the food bank throughout the year and we are so grateful for your ongoing support!



HEALING WITH HORSES: TRANSFORMING THROUGH TRUST





In Wiikwemkoong Unceded Territory, (on Manitoulin Island) the *Healing with Horses* program brings people together to share, listen, and connect with each other, the land, and the gentle strength of the horses guiding the healing journey.

Among them are four Ojibwe Spirit Horses, a rare and sacred breed. At one point in history, they were stolen from the community, but in an act of resilience and reconciliation, they have been returned to the land and the people who have always known and cherished them. Their presence is a living reminder of survival, restoration, and hope.

Supported by your *Mission and Service* gifts, the program blends equine therapy with Anishinaabe ways of knowing, the Medicine Wheel, and traditional teachings to support emotional, spiritual, and cultural healing. Children learn emotional regulation, adults reconnect with their inner strength, and participants find the courage to speak and be heard.
