





#### A FURTHER **UPDATE**

When the City of Toronto approved the re-zoning last fall, they placed an H or Holding Provision on the site until some minor technical designs for storm water management were approved. Options for Homes worked with City Staff to resolve the technical design matters and applied to have the H r emoved. The City gave notice (see Toronto Star) that they intend to remove the H. We anticipate that this process will be wrapped up in early October.

As we advised in last week's Wee VOICE, the SPA is a matter of Public Record, and can be review on the City of Toronto' Planning Application Portal. Here is the link if you are interested. All of the documents are now available on the site. (click on Supporting Documentation)



Summer holidays are over and we are all starting back into our norm. Why not make this year a little special - join the choir!


Have you always wanted to try it out but never got around to it? Well now's a great time to give it a go:


Stanford University.

#### WHY CANADA MISSES OUT ON SUNDAY'S TOTAL LUNAR ECLIPSE

September's 'poorly timed' Full Moon means Canada misses out on the second total lunar eclipse of 2025. However, there are still ways to see this astronomical event!


On September 7, 2025, the Moon and Earth will line up perfectly with the Sun in syzygy, causing the Moon to pass directly through Earth's shadow. As a result, the Moon will turn a dusky red colour, as much of the world witnesses a total lunar eclipse.

This eclipse occurs over the course of roughly four and a half hours, and according to timeanddate.com, it will be visible to around 7 billion people. That's about 85 per cent of the population of the planet.

The event peaks at exactly 2:11 p.m. EDT on the 7th. That is when the Moon lines up on the exact opposite side of Earth from the Sun.

Unfortunately, for those of us in Canada, that timing means that the Moon will also be on the exact opposite side of Earth from us.

Thus, unlike the March 14 "Pi Day" total lunar eclipse that shone in Canadian skies, this one won't be visible to us.



The regions of the world that will see the entire lunar eclipse are from eastern Africa, through central and eastern Asia, and western Australia. The rest of Africa, as well as Europe, far eastern Asia, and eastern Australia will get to see at least some of the total eclipse, either at moonrise or moonset.

The only parts of the western hemisphere that will see any of this eclipse are western Alaska, at moonset, and eastern Brazil, right at moonrise. However, skywatchers in those areas will need to look very closely, as the Moon will be in Earth's diffuse penumbra at the time, when it is challenging to notice any difference in its colour or brightness.

Given that shadows on Earth aren't red, why does Earth's shadow cast a red hue on the moon? The answer takes into account another aspect of life on Earth: our atmosphere. During a total eclipse, the only sunlight reaching the moon is passing through Earth's atmosphere. As rays of the sun's light pass through the atmosphere and bend around Earth, they pick up a reddish colour. The more dust or clouds in Earth's atmosphere during an eclipse, the redder the full moon will look.

This is the same reason that sunrises and sunsets appear red too. Here's how NASA puts it: "Blue light has a shorter wavelength and is scattered more easily by particles in Earth's atmosphere than red light, which has a longer wavelength. Red light, on the other hand,

travels more directly through the atmosphere. When the sun is overhead, we see blue light throughout the sky. But when the sun is setting, sunlight must pass through more atmosphere and travel farther before reaching our eyes. The blue light from the sun scatters away, and longer-wavelength red, orange, and yellow light pass through." As we said earlier, all the sunlight reaching the moon during a lunar eclipse is passing through Earth's atmosphere and thus will be red.

Earth, itself, blocks Canada's view of this 'blood moon', but there's still a way to watch!




