FROM THE PRESIDENT

Ewan Horsburgh has been the AURA president since 28 April, 2020 where he was successfully voted in by the members.

Ewan has represented Australia countless times in long distance events across the globe and led the Aussies as their Team Captain in the 2019 24hr World Championships in Albi, France.

2021 HAS BEEN ANOTHER TOUGH YEAR AND A CHALLENGE FOR RUNNERS AND RACE DIRECTORS. It's been great to see the resilience and determination in the running community. There have been a lot of inspiring stories in Ultramag of members' achievements and adventures around the country.

Our calendar had around 80 races but there was the repeat of 2020 with a few needing to be rescheduled or cancelled due to state restrictions. Next year's calendar is shaping up nicely with plenty of opportunities to race multiple distances and terrains.

We introduced the flat \$49 per year membership fee to simplify the process and give more value back to

the members who sign up for the full year. Hopefully, with a few recurring memberships and attracting new runners with the low cost our member base will keep growing.

We were pleased to announce the events successful in hosting AURA Australian Championships in 2022. This includes the introduction of a 100 Mile Australian Championship for the first time. The Australian Championships this year are as follows:

- 50km – Fisiocrem GC50 Run Festival, 4 December 2022
- 100km – TBC as finalising details
- 24hr – Southern Sydney 24 Hour Ultra, 3 June 2022
- 48hr – Sri Chinmoy 48 Hour Track Festival, 25 March 2022
- Short Trail – Two Bays Trail Run (56km), 16 January 2022
- Long Trail – Heysen 105 (115km), 22 October 2022
- 100 Mile – The Glasshouse 100, 10 September 2022

We are hoping next year is a safer one to travel which will allow us to select and send Australian teams to the World and Continental Championships. There will be more info around selection and dates so those interested can plan out their calendar and build ups.

In exciting news, we secured the hosting of a Championship event in our own country for the first time. The 2024 Asian and Oceania 24hr Championships are coming to Australia! For the next generation, I hope this provides motivation to work towards the dream of representing your country.

A highlight of the year was kicking off our series of webinars covering beginner ultra running and women in ultra running topics. A big thanks to the

organisers and the panel of speakers who put a lot of time into preparing content, wrangling the technical side of the delivery and then generously giving up their time to share their wisdom and experience. It's been great to see so many people wanting to give back to the sport and help more people enter the world of ultra running.

Once the year comes to a close our annual awards will be voted on and decided. It's always an interesting look back on the year and a celebration of our members' achievements. Last year's ultra runner of the year performances were weighted heavily in WA as their vibrant race calendar was border protected offering multiple opportunities to race a full season. This year there has been a more balanced mix of states even considering the lockdowns in NSW and Vic.

A massive thanks from myself and the committee for all the volunteers who have helped keep AURA moving forward and in a good position to keep supporting the ultra running community. Special mention needs to go to 3 retiring volunteers who have put a lot into AURA over the years. Jodie Osborne, Kerrie Bremner and Susannah Harvey-Jamieson have contributed as Australian reps, committee members and also in specialised roles.

Thanks to Kate Dzienis for keeping the entertaining and educational stories flowing through Ultramag including the end-of-year special.

Personally, I'd like to say a big thanks to the committee Simone Hayes, Matty Eckford and Stephen Redfern who's support and commitment keep the AURA wheels turning. The regular committee meetings, daily messages, side phone calls, long run discussions, votes, member management and all the activities you do to keep the association progressing are appreciated.

RECORDS NOTES

In 2021, we saw a rise of younger ultra runners in both the male and female age groups of between 20-30 coming to the fore.

Both **Cassie Cohen** and **Chloe Skewes-Weir** excelled in the 6hr distance at Canberra with **Dominic Bullock**, **Matthew Gore** and **Cody McKellar** hunting down great distances in the 12hr in Coburg.

Dominic ran an outstanding 149.277km in his

very first ultra. This is very exciting for the future of ultra running in Australia.

Tia Jones was able to achieve new W55 records in Canberra and was successful in breaking her own new 6hr record later on in the year in Sydney together with a new 50km record.

Wayne Spies had an awesome run in the Canberra 50km Championships and set a new M45-49 record with a very fast time of 3:02:53.

Clay Dawson set an excellent new 50miles record as part of the 100km Championships which he then went on to win.

Greg Ponych was delighted with his new M55-59 record for the 12hr of 119.477km.

Marie Boyd topped off the year of great new Australian age group records by beating her own 6 day W70-74 record in Arizona, USA with a whopping 400.085km.

AUSTRALIAN FEMALE ULTRA RUNNER OF THE YEAR TIA JONES

FOR OUTSTANDING SINGLE OR COLLECTIVE PERFORMANCE BY A FEMALE

Tia Jones (Qld) had an outstanding year of running in 2021, breaking no fewer than 5 Australian W55 Age Group Records. Tia's records were achieved at two races in 2021 – the Sri Chinmoy 12hr Track Ultra (March) and the Southern Sydney 6hr Track Ultra (June). The Records that Tia achieved were: 50km (4:15:46), 6hr (69.774km), 50 mile (7:18:22), 100km (9:17:02) and 12hr (124.211km), with the 6hr only being 1.5km and the 12hr being 2km short of the overall World W55 record. An amazing year of top performances and records, congratulations Tia on your achievements!

Matthew Crehan (Vic) had a phenomenal year of racing with no less than 6 wins out of the 7 events he competed in. He also secured a 4th place finish from 1129 runners at the 2021 UTA in the 100km. Matthew's events included the 45km Buller Sky Run, 64km Razorback, 80km Margret River Ultra and 80km Cradle Ultra, as well as two 100 mile races at both the Brisbane Trail Ultra and Alpine Challenge. Matthew also managed to break course records at the BTU 100 miler, Alpine Challenge 100 miler, Margret River Ultra and the 64km Razorback Ultra. An outstanding year of racing and achievements Matthew, congratulations!

This finish has given Margaret the best finish for a female runner in Australia for the now very popular racing of the Last One Standing backyard ultra format. She ran a personal best, passing the 200 mile mark to take out the win with an amazing total of 322.352km. This result not only saw Cheryl take the win, but she also placed 3rd outright at the 48hr race. According to the DUV yearly rankings, it placed her distance as the world's 5th best female in a 48hr performance for 2021. Sarah has now raced in quite a number of 100km ultras and is showing great form as a young runner with a bright future in ultra running.
