
AUTRA International Team Selection Policy

Adopted: 25 August 2025

Approved by: AUTRA Committee

1. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to set out a clear, transparent, and equitable framework for the selection of Australian national teams representing Australia at World and Asian ultra-distance, trail, and mountain running championships. This policy ensures that team selection processes uphold the highest standards of fairness, integrity, and athlete welfare, and align with the requirements of international governing bodies such as the IAU, ITRA, World Athletics, and WMRA. It also outlines the criteria, responsibilities, and procedures that underpin all selection decisions, to provide clarity for athletes, selectors, and stakeholders.

2. Scope

This policy applies to all athletes seeking selection to represent Australia at World and Asian Oceania ultra-distance, trail, and mountain running championships under AUTRA's authority, as well as to selection committee members, team officials, and others involved in the selection process. The policy covers elements including application procedures, eligibility, selection criteria and processes, team member responsibilities, appeals process, and associated administrative and compliance requirements for AUTRA-sanctioned international competitions.

3. Statement of Commitment

AUTRA is committed to upholding integrity, equity, and transparency in all selection decisions, in accordance with the Sport Integrity Australia National Integrity Framework, relevant competition rules, and best practice governance standards.

4. Definitions

- **Athlete:** Any competitor seeking selection.
- **Crew/Support Personnel:** Individuals providing direct team support.
- **Event:** Any international competition approved by AUTRA.

5. Roles & Responsibilities

- **AUTRA Committee:** Endorses all international team selections and reviews policy application annually.
- **Selection Committee:** Ensures fair and compliant selection in accordance with stated criteria.
- **Members, Athletes, Crew:** Expected to abide by all selection policy requirements and report any procedural concerns.

6. Review

This policy will be reviewed every two (2) years or sooner if required due to changes to AUTRA's governing rules, relevant laws, or integrity frameworks.

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1. Overview

1. The Australian Ultra and Trail Runners' Association (AUTRA) is officially endorsed by the International Association of Ultrarunners (IAU), International Trail Runners Association (ITRA), World Athletics (WA) and World Mountain Running Association (WMRA) to select male and female teams to represent Australia at World and Asian ultra-distance, Trail & Mountain running events:
 - a. 24hr
 - b. 100km
 - c. 50km
 - d. Short & Long Course Trail
 - e. Mountain Running
 - f. Under 20's (WTMRC) or under 23's (APTRC) Trail
2. World & Asian Oceania Championships for 24hr and 100km are organised by the IAU biannually, 50km World Championships annually.
3. World Mountain and Trail Running Championships (WMTRC) and Asia Pacific Trail Running Championships (APTRC) for Mountain and Trail (Short & Long distances) running including Under 20's (WTMRC) & Under 23's (APTRC) is organised by the IAU, ITRA, WA & WMRA biannually.

2. Citizenship

1. Applicants must be citizens of Australia at the time of submitting their application, and throughout the Championship period.

3. Application Process

1. Applicants must be a current financial member in good standing of the Australian Ultra & Trail Runners' Association (AUTRA) prior to applying for selection and throughout the Championship period.
2. Successful applicants will be required to pay a \$350 Championship participation levy, to be paid on notification of being successful, but before any official team announcement is released to AUTRA members and public.
3. The Championship participation levy will apply and be payable by all selected athletes on the team.
4. Applications will open approximately 3 months prior to the scheduled Championship date (where possible).
5. Applications will remain open for a minimum 2 weeks (where possible).
6. Application period will close with sufficient time for:
 - a. The selection process to be undertaken and completed.
 - b. A team announcement to be made a minimum of 2 months prior to the scheduled Championship date.
7. Athletes who are selected, and subject to undertaking a fitness/performance test, qualifying race and/or required to provide a Sports Medical Physician report will be named in the initial team announcement as "pending" with their fitness/performance test, qualifying race and/or awaiting medical clearance noted.

4. Representation Eligibility

1. AUTRA has adopted World Athletics Policy C3.2 'Eligibility to Represent a Member Rules in force from 1 November 2019' which states:
 - a. 1.4 'An athlete who has competed on behalf of the Country or Territory of a Member in a National Representative Competition or in any Other Relevant Competition shall not be eligible to represent another Member in a National Representative Competition.
 - b. 1.4.2 'Alternatively, an athlete may represent another Member with the approval of World Athletics, which approval shall be conditional upon:
 - (i) The athlete observing a waiting period of three years from the date that application for approval is made to World Athletics (during which period the athlete must not represent any other Member in National Representative Competition or compete in any Other relevant Competition) and;
 - (ii) The athlete demonstrating that as at the end of the three year waiting period:
 - a) They are or will be ages twenty or over; and
 - b) They are or will be a Citizen of the Country or of the parent Country of the Territory which the Member represents; and
 - c) They are or will have a genuine, close, credible and established link to that Country or Territory (e.g. through Residence there)
2. Therefore, as per World Athletics Policy C3.2: If an athlete has represented another country in a World and/or Asian Championship, then the athlete is NOT eligible to apply to represent Australia (unless approval from World Athletics has been granted and/or a three year waiting period is applied).
3. Applicants can only be representative of the country/Federation they are competing for at the time of application, up to and throughout the Championship period.

5. Team Member Responsibilities

All selected team members are required to:

1. Prioritise their preparation for the Championship, demonstrating commitment to high performance and the reputation of Australia.
2. Comply at all times with the following AUTRA agreements, as a condition of team selection and ongoing participation:
 - a. AUTRA Athletes Agreement: International Competition
 - b. AUTRA Athletes Code of Conduct: International Competition
 - c. Any other agreements or policies set down by AUTRA
3. Team members must ensure they have read, understood, and signed all required agreements and code of conduct declarations prior to team confirmation. Breaches of these or any other relevant AUTRA or event-specific policies may result in disciplinary action including removal from the team, pursuant to the *2.5 Complaints, Disputes & Discipline Policy (Version 1, 14 August 2025)* and other applicable procedures.
4. Selected athletes are also expected to promptly communicate any factors (e.g., injury, change in eligibility) that may affect their availability or compliance with AUTRA or Championship requirements.

6. Qualifying Criteria

1. 24 Hour, 100km & 50km World & Asian Oceania Championship Selection

1. Primary Qualifying Criteria:
 - a. Athletes who achieve a National A, B or C qualifier as per the Benchmark Qualifying table listed below.
2. Secondary Qualifying Criteria:
 - a. Athletes who have not met the primary qualification criteria as listed in item (6.1.1.a) above, may be considered for selection, with all remaining places on the team considered by the Selection Committee.
 - b. The Selection Committee will consider all races that applicants have submitted in Australia and overseas, from recent and past performances in its assessment.
 - c. If athletes believe they have shown strong & recent results in road/track events or have previously met the primary qualifying criteria, they are encouraged to apply.

2. Mountain & Trail Running (Including U20) World Championship Selection

1. WMTRC – World Mountain and Trail Running Championships (including U20), will be managed by Athletics Australia (AA) on behalf of the World Athletics (WA), International Trail Runners Association (ITRA) and World Mountain Running Association (WMRA) for all future Championship selections until further notice.
2. For WMTRC Athlete team selection, refer to the Athletics Australia website for all information on the selection criteria and selection policy (www.athletics.com.au)

3. Asia Pacific Trail Running (Including U23) Championship Selection

1. Primary Qualifying Criteria:
 - a. Athletes who achieve an ITRA score qualifier as per the Benchmark Qualifying tables listed below

8. Selection Criteria

1. Achievement of a qualifier does not entitle an athlete to automatic selection.
2. Achieving a qualifier is only one of numerous prerequisites to be considered for selection by the Selection Committee and/or AUTRA Committee. Other factors considered, but not limited to include:
 - a. Recent performance
 - b. Previous representation performance
 - c. Adherence to AUTRA's Policies whilst an AUTRA member and during any previous international representation, e.g. AUTRA Athlete's Agreement, AUTRA Code of Conduct.
 - d. Any other matter or items deemed relevant by the Selection Committee and/or AUTRA Committee.
3. A fitness/performance test and/or supplementary 'qualifying' race may be required upon request.
4. A Sports Medical Physician report may be required upon request. (Note: Reports/letters from Physiotherapists, Chiropractors and Coaches etc. do/will not suffice).
5. A performance which achieves a benchmark qualifier will only be valid where it is achieved within the time period listed below, for the World or Asian Championship in question:
 - a. 24 months for 24hr events,
 - b. 20 months for 50km & 100km events,
 - c. Current ITRA index score for Asian Trail (Short and Long course) events,
 - d. For WTMRC, refer to the Athletics Australia website for all information on valid qualifying periods (www.athletics.com.au)
6. The qualifying period (24 months or 20 months) is fixed to the date of the World or Asian Championship event in question.

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7. For 24hr, 50km & 100km events, in addition to the above qualifying period, results from World and Asian Championships held in the preceding 2 calendar years will be considered as primary qualifiers, even if they fall outside the 24 month (for 24hr) or 20 month (for 50km & 100km) period.

9. Championship Team Allocations

1. Subject to the rules outlined in each of the championship events Local Organising Committee's (LOC) General Information Sheet (GIS) relating to overall team sizes and athlete numbers for each category, the Australian Ultra & Trail Runners' Association (AUTRA) may select:
 - a. 24 Hour Championships (World & Asian) – select up to a max of 9 male and 9 female athletes (with 6 male & female athletes to make up the representing team, and top 3 male & female athletes to contribute to the overall score)
 - b. 100km Championships (World & Asian) – select up to a max of 9 male and 9 female athletes (with 6 male & female athletes to make up the representing team, and top 3 male & female athletes to contribute to the overall score)
 - c. 50km Championships (World & Asian) – select up to a max of 9 male and 9 female athletes (with 6 male & female athletes to make up the representing team, and top 3 male & female athletes to contribute to the overall score)
 - d. Asia Pacific Trail Running Championships (APTRC) – select up to a maximum of 8 Athletes (male or female) in each event, and up to a maximum of 4 Athletes (male or female) for each U23's event
 - e. World Trail and Mountain Running Championships (WTMRC) – refer to the Athletics Australia website for all information on team allocations (www.athletics.com.au)
2. In line with the current selection criteria and selection process contained within this Selection Policy, the Australian Ultra & Trail Runners' Association (AUTRA) may elect to select and send a team smaller than the maximum available number of positions available per country in each category as outlined in Section 9.1.(a to e)
3. An athlete may only be considered for selection in an event that they have nominated for as part of the team nomination process.
4. Subject to the rules of the LOC relating to the number of athletes who may be selected for each event and for the Team overall, the Selection Committee may exercise discretion to select further athletes to the Team in line with Section 9.1 above. This discretion will be exercised in line with the AUTRA Selection Policy. This discretion is absolute and need not be exercised by the selection committee.

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5. To be eligible for discretionary selection, athletes must still meet the qualifying criteria set out in Section 6 of this policy.
 6. Without limiting its discretion, the Selection Committee may consider any factor, or combination of factors that, in its opinion, is relevant for consideration when selecting discretionary athletes for the Team, that is outlined in this Selection Policy to identify priority athletes.

10. Selection Process

1. The AUTRA Committee will forward all applications to the Selection Committee as soon as possible after the selection period closes.
2. The Selection Committee will deliberate and provide their final team selection via the Selection Committee Chairperson to the AUTRA Committee as soon as possible.
3. The Delegate (AUTRA President) will:
 - a. Attempt to contact all athletes who applied, a minimum 24 hours prior to the team announcement on social media (e.g. Facebook)
 - b. Notify applicant/s where their submission has been successful.
 - c. Notify applicant/s where their submission has been unsuccessful.
 - d. Notify applicant/s where their submission is pending and will be reviewed if they are required to:
 - (i) Undertake a fitness/performance test, qualifying race and/or provide a Sports Medical Physician report.
4. All selections are made on a provisional basis only and, at the discretion of the AUTRA Committee, can be revoked at any time.
5. Any disputes from athletes regarding the selection process and/or selection outcome/s are to contact the Delegate (AUTRA President) in the first instance.
6. For any Selection Appeals Application resulting from the selection and/or selection outcome/s, refer to Section 13, of this document for further information.
7. Athletes are not permitted at any time to contact any member of the Selection Committee.
8. All enquiries over team selection are to be addressed in writing to the Delegate (AUTRA President).

11. Removal of Athlete

1. A selected athlete may be removed from the Team for any of the following reasons:
 - a. A voluntary withdrawal notified in writing by the athlete to the Australian Ultra & Trail Runners' Association (AUTRA) Delegate (President) or Committee
 - b. Injury or illness certified by a medical practitioner and approved by the Australian Ultra & Trail Runners' Association (AUTRA)
 - c. A violation of any applicable or relevant AUTRA Policy e.g. Athlete's Agreement International Competition, AUTRA Athlete's Code of Conduct International Competition
 - d. The athlete's eligibility status changes so that the athlete is ineligible to participate in the Championship Event as per Section 2 to 4 of this policy
 - e. The athlete's event is removed from the Event program
 - f. Failure to pay any applicable fees and/or charges related to their participation in the Championships prior to the FEF submission.
2. An athlete who is removed from the Team pursuant to this provision has the right to an appeal in accordance with Section 13 of this policy, the *2.5 Complaints, Disputes & Discipline Policy (Version 1, 14 August 2025)*, and Division 3 – Grievance Procedures (Rules 25 to 29) of the Australian Ultra & Trail Runners' Association Incorporated Rules.
3. Any Athlete who has withdrawn from the Team, as outlined in Section 11.1 of this policy will forfeit and not have refunded any or all of the Athlete Participation fee payable in Section 3.2 of this policy

12. Replacement of Athlete

1. Replacement athletes will be determined in accordance with the following process:
 - a. If the replacement athlete is to be determined prior to the announcement of the Team names, the replacement athlete will be selected by the AUTRA Selection Committee based on the selection procedure set out in Section 6 to 10 of this policy
 - b. If the replacement athlete is to be determined after the announcement of the Team names to the Local Organising Committee (LOC) of the Championship Event, the replacement athlete will be selected subject to the eligibility rules set out by the LOC of the Event and based on the selection procedures set out in Section 6 to 10 of this policy
2. Australian Ultra & Trail Runners' Association (AUTRA) reserves its right, at its absolute discretion, not to replace any withdrawn athletes.

13. Selection Appeals Process

1. The selection appeal process will be conducted in accordance with Part 3, Division 3 – Grievance Procedures (Rules 25 to 29) of the Australian Ultra & Trail Runners' Association Incorporated Rules and the *2.5 Complaints, Disputes & Discipline Policy (Version 1, 14 August 2025)*.
2. Where an eligible selection appeal has been referred to the AUTRA Delegate (President) or AUTRA Committee and cannot be resolved between the athlete and the AUTRA Committee, the matter will proceed to appeals mediation in accordance with Section 13.1 of this policy and the *2.5 Complaints, Disputes & Discipline Policy (Version 1, 14 August 2025)*. All parties agree to abide by the outcome of the mediation process.

14. Team Funding

1. Effective 01 January 2025, all International Championship teams will be self-funded, with team and selected individual athletes to pay any applicable fees and charges relating to their participation in the event, which can include, but not limited to airfares, ground transport, accommodation, entry fees, extra uniforms and insurance. A Championship participation levy (as noted in section 3 of the policy) will also apply, to be payable by all athletes upon selection and prior to being announced on the team.
2. Athletes are responsible for all costs associated with their representation at the Championship, with some notable exceptions:
 - a. IAU and/or LOC funded accommodation provisions for athletes as per the General Information Sheet (GIS) relating to the event
 - b. IAU and/or LOC funding provisions for individuals and teams as per the Championship General Information Sheet (GIS)
3. All IAU and/or LOC provisions (noted in above 2 points) whether individual or team will be pooled to support or assist the cost of team members.
4. The allocation and duration of any possible AUTRA funding support can and will vary depending on the Championship.
5. If the AUTRA budget has been fully allocated, team members that meet the criteria can be selected on the basis they pay any short fall in board provisions.
6. Performance bonus payments, will be made after the Championship event has taken place, if the following distances or times are achieved, as set out in the Benchmark Performance Bonus tables listed below:
7. Athletes invited by the Selection Committee and/or Committee to attend in addition to the already selected team may not share in the IAU/LOC or AUTRA funding, however, will be eligible for performance bonuses.

8. Athletes choosing not to utilise the IAU and/or LOC accommodation options may not be eligible for any individual or team IAU and/or LOC grant funding or subsequent AUTRA performance bonus payments (where their performance may have otherwise achieved this).
9. AUTRA will make the following payments to individuals who are selected to serve as official Team Manager and fulfill this duty for the entirety of the Championship:
 - a. For International 24H, 100km, 50km & Trail Championships: \$1,500
 - b. For Domestic 24H, 100km, 50km & Trail Championships: \$750
 - c. The Team Manager's accommodation costs at the team hotel for the allocated nights will be paid for by AUTRA in full.
10. No changes can be made to athlete and/or crew/supporter accommodation once the Final Entry Form (FEF) has been submitted to the Championship Organisers.
11. **Note: Do not commit to accommodation booking/s unless you are 100% certain all parties can and will attend.**
12. In the event that an athlete withdraws or is withdrawn by the AUTRA Committee or Selection Committee from the team and does not attend for any reason, including but not limited to:
 - a. Injury/illness
 - b. Voluntary Withdrawal
 - c. Disciplinary Action
13. The Athlete will still be liable for all costs including, but not limited to accommodation, team uniforms or any other costs associated with the team's participation in the championships. These costs must be paid in full by the Athlete, notwithstanding their withdrawal or non-attendance.
14. To be eligible to participate in an AUTRA endorsed Australian Team representing in Championships, Athletes must pay all outstanding costs and fees owed to AUTRA in full prior to submitting their application.

16. Team Uniform

1. For first-time athletes, a uniform will be provided at no cost, comprising:
 - a. Team jacket
 - b. Team pants
 - c. Team polo shirt
 - d. Choice of either a race shirt or race singlet
2. Uniform items that remain in good condition are expected to be reused for future international representation.
3. For returning athletes, one uniform item will be supplied at no cost, limited to the choice of either a team polo shirt, race shirt, or race singlet.
4. Additional uniform items may be purchased at the time of order at the athlete's own expense.
5. The cost of the team polo shirt, which must be worn by all selected official crew during the event, is to be covered by the nominating team athletes.

17. Official Crew

1. An application process will be available for Athletes to nominate individuals as official crew.
2. Adherence to AUTRA's Policies during any previous international representation, including any other factors AUTRA may deem relevant will be considered when selecting crew.
3. Crew are expected to assist a minimum of two and maximum of three athletes in any given Championship event.
4. Crew must be available for the entire duration of the Championship.
5. Crew may also be required to assist up to six hours prior and post championship race due to organisational requirements.
6. Where possible, crew members may also be utilised in support roles (e.g. ferry between accommodation/event, provision of meals for crew, photography/video, etc.)
7. For 24hr Championships, a selection of three or up to a maximum of six crew will be selected as per the Race General Information Sheet (GIS), depending on team size to support the runners throughout the race.
8. For 100km & 50km events, a maximum of three crew only will be selected as per the LOC General Information Sheet (GIS) guidelines, due to reduced needs and access to athletes on the course.
9. For Mountain & Trail Running events, a maximum of three crew only will be selected as per the LOC General Information Sheet (GIS) guidelines, due to reduced needs and access to athletes on the course.
10. All Crew will need to sign and comply with the AUTRA Athletes Agreement and AUTRA Crew Agreement.

18. Selection Committee

1. The Selection Committee will be made of a minimum five current AUTRA members.
2. Applications for the Selection Committee will be sought at the discretion of the AUTRA Committee, which is usually either annually or biannually in June.
3. The AUTRA Committee will make appointments after the nominations have been open for one week.
4. Successful applicants will be notified of the appointment via email.
5. Selection Committee appointments will be for either one or two years, with no split rotation.
6. It is at the discretion of the AUTRA Committee as to whether the Selection Committee appointments are for one or two years.
7. The AUTRA Committee has the right to appoint members to the Selection Committee for a two year period and at any time alter that appointment to a one year period.
8. Notwithstanding that a member has been appointed to the Selection Committee, the AUTRA Committee may at any time remove that member at its discretion.
9. Immediately after each selection process and subsequent appointments, the minimum five selectors will appoint one of their members as the Selection Committee Chairperson for the same one year or two year period.
10. Any selector that has a vested interest in any athlete applying for selection (e.g. coach – running coach, mindset coach, mentor physio, specialist, etc.) must step aside for the selection in question due to a conflict of interest.
11. Any selector applying as an athlete to a Championship Team, must step aside for the selection in question due to a conflict of interest.

19. Selection Committee Chairperson

1. Will liaise with the AUTRA Committee regarding selection processes and guidelines.
2. Will co-ordinate with the other members of the Selection Committee to select the National Teams.
3. Ensure the selection process is conducted in a timely manner and communicated to the AUTRA Committee including the Delegate (AUTRA President) by the required deadline.

20. Team Manager

1. For each Championship (24hr, 100km, 50km & Trail Worlds or Asian), AUTRA may choose to appoint a person in the role of Team Manager.
2. The Team Manager will be selected and/or appointed by the AUTRA Committee after the team application process and announcement has been made.
3. Upon selection, the Team Manager's role will be to work with the AUTRA Committee in supporting the team and runners in the lead up to and during the Championships.

21. Delegate

1. The Delegate for International World & Asian Oceania Selections is the AUTRA President.
2. In the event of the President's absence or unavailability, the Delegation will fall to the AUTRA Vice President.
3. In the event of the President applying as an athlete to a Championship Team, the Delegation will fall to the AUTRA Vice President.
4. Communicate with all athletes who have applied for team selection, including advice of successful selection and unsuccessful selection.
5. It is at the discretion of the Delegate if advice of international selection is provided to the athlete via phone and/or email.
6. The first point of contact for any athlete disputes regarding all team selections.

22. Amendments to Policy

1. This policy is subject to review and amendment at any time in accordance with Part 5, Division 1, Rule 42.3(c) of the Australian Ultra & Trail Runners' Association Incorporated Rules and the *1.6 Policy Review & Amendment Procedure (Version 1, 14 August 2025)*. Amendments may be made at the discretion of the AUTRA Committee in response to changes in law, organisational needs, or feedback from stakeholders.
