ANNUAL REPORT - 2018

Dear Members,

Your committee is pleased to report on the activities of your association for the financial year ended 31 December 2018.

OVERVIEW OF 2018

2018 was a busy and productive year for AURA, highlights included:

- The Association comprised 503 members in December 2018, an increase of 28 on 2017.
- There were 57 events listed on AURA's calendar of events, with thousands of runners participating in ultra running events on track, road and trail across the country.
- Australian teams participated in IAU World Championships, representing
 Australia proudly at both the Trail event held in Penyagolosa, Spain in May and
 the 100km event in Sveti Martin na Murin Croatia in September. As well a team
 was entered in the 2018 Asian 24 Hour Championships held in Taipei in
 December.
- A comprehensive strategic blueprint for AURA was finalised after contributions were received during 2018 from subcommittees. The strategy addresses
 - o awareness and participation
 - o sustainability of events
 - o funding opportunities outside of current revenue streams
 - o member well being and equity
 - o elite performance


The document was released to members for comment in early 2019.



- Discussions continued with Athletics Australia to potentially formalise a relationship. A meeting was organized for early 2019 to progress this initiative.



AURA AWARDS 2018

The AURA Awards for 2018 were presented as follows:

AUSTRALIAN FEMALE ULTRA RUNNER OF THE YEAR: TIA JONES

For the second year in a row, Tia Jones was named as the Australian Female Ultra Runner of the Year, awarded for outstanding single or collective performances by a female. Tia's standout performances included a silver medal at the 2018 Asian 24 Hour Championships, an 8:33 run at the World 100km Championships, first place at Ned Kelly Chase 50km, second place at the Gold Coast 50km and first place with 131km at the Canberra 12 hour event. Tia also set a number of age group records.

AUSTRALIAN MALE ULTRA RUNNER OF THE YEAR: BRENDAN DAVIES Awarded for outstanding single or collective performances by a male. Brendan had an incredible year with multiple top finishes on trail, road and track including winning the Ultra-Trail Australia 100km event against a highly competitive field, 25th place at the World 100km Championships, third at the Adelaide 24 Hour race plus numerous other wins and podium finishes at AURA events.

HELEN STANGER AWARD: ANNABEL HEPWORTH

Annabel was the winner of this award for the greatest single best ultra running achievement by a female under the age of 60 for her 742km at the Adelaide 6 Day Event, the furthest 6 Day distance by a female in the world in 2018.

BRYAN SMITH AWARD: MICK THWAITES

Awarded for the greatest single best ultra running achievement by a male under the age of 60 to Mick Thwaites, for his 837kms at the EMU 6 Day World Trophy, third best distance in the world for 2018. Mick also won this award in 2016 and 2017.



YOUNG FEMALE ULTRA RUNNER OF THE YEAR: LARISSA TICHON

Larissa Tichon performed strongly at a number of events in Australia and overseas including first place at the Canberra 50km race. This award is presented for outstanding single or collective performances by a female under the age of 30.

YOUNG MALE ULTRA RUNNER OF THE YEAR: DAN SYMONDS

Awarded for outstanding single or collective performances by a male under the age of 30. Dan became an emerging 24 Hour runner with his 207km at the Canberra 24 Hour race, he then followed this up with 221km and first position at the BUTTER24.

CLIFF YOUNG AWARD: JOHN TIMMS

Awarded for the greatest single best ultra running achievement by a male over the age of 60. John Timms won this award for his 504km run at the Adelaide 6 day race, he beat the previous best distance by an Australian runner in the men's 75 age group by an impressive 70km.

SHIRLEY YOUNG AWARD: SUE ROBERTSON

Sue Robertson wins the inaugural Shirley Young Award for her 6:34 result at the 50km Yaberoo Trail Ultra. This award recognises the greatest single best ultra running achievement by a female over the age of 60.

AURA ULTRA PERFORMANCE OF THE YEAR: ANNABEL HEPWORTH

The winner of the AURA Ultra performance of the Year Award is voted by AURA members.

In 2018 the members chose Annabel Hepworth for her 742km performance at the Adelaide 6 Day event.



AUSTRALIAN RECORDS

While the women dominated records in 2017 the men dominated in 2018 and it was great to see a number of younger athletes those in the Men 20-24 and 25-29 category and at the other end of the scale records in the M75 and M70 categories were achieved. The rankings are a good guide for those who are seeking selection and the competition in some events is quite fierce. It's a great period in Ultra Running for Australia.

The first records achieved were at the Australia Day Ultra 100km in Australiad, Western Australia. Kevin Matthews bettered the record of one Australia's most prolific ultra-runners from the 1990's Bryan Smith. Bryan's record for M50-54 for 100km has stood since September 1995. That wasn't the longest standing record to fall in 2018. John Shaw now in the M65-69 age category smashed the 50km record which has stood since 1992 at the Ned Kelly Chase in Wangaratta. This performance for M65-69 was also a World Age Best a significant achievement for John who has taken up running later in life. John is now tentatively testing his endurance over 6 hours and potentially 100km.

A couple of records were achieved at the Canberra track event hosted by Billy Pearce which attracted a sold-out field. Dan Symonds achieved records in the 24 hour event clocking up 207.799km and along the way achieved records for 100 miles and 200km. Later in the year Dan bettered those M25-29 records on the track in Brisbane. Potentially benefiting from a performance in very familiar surrounds Dan improved the 24-hour record by 13.27km to bring the new record over 220km with 221.069km and lowered the 100mile time by over an hour covering just over 403 laps of the track in 18:17:02 and 200km in 22:09:26.



Sharing the track in Brisbane for 24 hours was Oliver Armstrong. Oliver burst onto the ultra-scene earlier this year with an outstanding performance at the Wildhorse Criterium 12 hour over the Easter weekend just north of Brisbane. Joel Claxton had set the standard earlier in the year in the M20-24 category setting the record for 24 hours at 181.229km, 100 miles in a time of 20:04:22 and 12 hours with 105.600km. Joel retains the 12-hour record, but Oliver surpassed the 24 hour for men 20-24 with a distance of 192.262km and 100 miles in 19:36:31.

The true test of endurance has to be in multi day events. This year a number of 6 day records were achieved. Firstly by Mick Thwaites in Hungary in the M40-44 category with 837.605km. In Adelaide it was great to see John Timms achieve a record in the M75-79 category for 500km.


