Your heart will be quickened when you hear Ezekiel 47 at Ein Gedi, where water will flow from the Mount of Olives into the Dead Sea. May our lives be forever changed as we embark on this incredible journey!

Tour Itinerary

Day 1 & 2 - The Journey Begins



Key Places: Tel Aviv, Joppa, Caesarea, Mount Carmel, and Tiberias

We arrive in Tel Aviv this evening, where a Templeton Tours representative will greet us and assist with luggage. After airport formalities, we meet our local guide and driver and begin touring the Holy Land. Our first stop is Joppa, where Jonah set sail for Tarshish, where Tabitha (Dorcas) was raised by Peter, and Peter received the vision of salvation for the Gentiles. We then head to our hotel on the Mediterranean Sea for dinner and overnight. (D)

After breakfast, we travel north to Caesarea by the Sea to explore the Crusaders' castle, Roman theater, Paul's seaport, and the Roman aqueduct. We continue to Mount Carmel, site of Elijah's triumph over the prophets of Baal. After lunch, we head to Megiddo, where prophecy comes alive as we overlook the Valley of Armageddon and explore Solomon's stables and ancient water systems. Our next stop is at The Precipice, where an angry crowd tried to throw Jesus off the cliff. Before reaching Tiberias, we stop in Cana, where Jesus turned water into wine. We end the day with dinner and overnight in Tiberias, on the Sea of Galilee. (B/L/D)

Day 3 - Jesus' Northern Ministry



Key Places: Sea of Gallilee, Capernaum, Mount of Beatitudes, and Magdala

After breakfast, we will begin the day with a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee, pausing for a brief worship service to reflect on the miracles Jesus performed in this region. We dock at Nof Ginossar to visit the famous "Jesus Boat" museum, where a 2,000-year-old fishing boat from Jesus' time is on display, offering a unique glimpse into first-century life on the lake. We will then visit the Primacy of Peter, where Jesus instructed Peter, "Feed my sheep," followed by a stop in Capernaum, where we'll see the ruins of Peter's house. Here, we will also see an ancient synagogue—a center of Jesus' teaching and ministry. After lunch, we will travel to the Mount of Beatitudes, where Jesus preached the Sermon on the Mount, overlooking the stunning Jordan Valley. We will then continue our scenic journey north and enjoy amazing views of Mount Hermon in the distance. We will visit the town of Magdala, where a synagogue from the time of Jesus has been recently excavated, offering a powerful connection to His life and ministry. Finally, we will end the day by returning to our hotel for dinner and a time of rest and reflection. (B/L/D)

Day 4 - Old Testament Wonders



Key Places: Beit She'an, Jordan Valley, Jericho, Bethabara, and Dead Sea

This morning, we will leave the Galilee area and travel south through the scenic Jordan River Valley. Along the way, we will stop and visit the impressive new excavations at Beit She'an, the ancient city where the Philistines hung the bodies of Saul and Jonathan. We will continue through the Jordan Valley to Jericho, one of the oldest continually inhabited cities in the world. If conditions permit, we will enter Jericho to explore the excavations of the ancient city walls, view the Mount of Temptation where Jesus was tested, and see Elisha's Spring, a symbol of miraculous renewal. Next, we'll stop at Bethabara, the traditional site where John baptized those who came to him (John 1:28). This area, also known as the "place of crossing," is believed to be near where the Israelites miraculously crossed the Jordan River into the Promised Land (Joshua 3:14-17). Next, we continue to the Dead Sea, which is 1300 feet below sea level and is the lowest spot on the earth. Be sure you take time to float in the Dead Sea or the freshwater pool and spa. The waters are made up of 25% salt and are so dense that it's impossible to sink. You can literally sit up in the water as if you were in a chair. This evening, we enjoy a wonderful meal together at our hotel on the Dead Sea (B/L/D).

Day 5 - Marvels in the Desert



Key Places: Masada, Ein Gedi, Qumran, and the Valley of the Shadow of Death, Jerusalem

This morning, we'll get an early start and head to the mountain fortress of Masada, a powerful symbol of Jewish perseverance. We'll ascend by cable car to explore the impressive ruins where Jewish zealots made their final stand against the Romans. The site features the remains of Herod's palaces, storerooms, cisterns, and a 6th-century Byzantine church, all set against sweeping desert views. From there, we visit Ein Gedi, a peaceful desert oasis where David hid from King Saul, surrounded by springs and rugged cliffs. We then travel to Qumran, the site where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered, offering a glimpse into the world of the Essenes and early biblical history. We then journey onward to Jerusalem, Israel's historic and spiritual capital for over 3,000 years and pause on Mount Scopus, where our guide will lead us in the traditional Jewish Welcome. Before settling in for the night, take in your first panoramic view of the holy city. Dinner and overnight will be at our hotel in Jerusalem. (B/L/D)

Day 6 - The Holy City: Jerusalem



Key Places: Temple Mount, Pool of Bethesda, Mount of Olives, Model City, and Bethlehem

This morning, conditions permitting, we will begin our tour with a visit to the Temple Mount where the Jewish temple stood until its destruction by the Roman Legions in 70 A.D. There we will see the Dome of the Rock Mosque built over the rock where Abraham prepared to sacrifice Isaac, the Al-Aqsa Mosque, and the Golden Gate. We'll continue our walk through the Old City to the beautiful Crusader Church dedicated to St. Anne and the nearby Pool of Bethesda. Then we travel a short distance to the Mount of Olives for a breathtaking view of the city of Jerusalem. While we are here, our guide will point out all of the important sites of Jerusalem. After lunch, we will visit the Model City of Jerusalem as it was in 69 AD. If conditions permit, we will then take a short drive to Bethlehem to visit the Church of the Nativity, built over the cave of Christ's birth, as well as the Shepherd's Field and plains of Boaz. Before returning to our hotel, we will visit one of the famous Bethlehem gift shops. Here, you will be able to shop for a perfect souvenir to remember your journey. (B/L/D)

Day 7 - Sites of Jesus' Teachings



Key Places: Western Wall, Pilate's Palace, Upper Room, Jewish Quarter, and the Southern Wall Excavations.

We begin the day at the famous Western Wall, a sacred site of prayer and reflection in the heart of the Old City. Then we will visit the Antonia Fortress, traditionally identified as the site of Pontius Pilate's palace, where Jesus was condemned. From there, we'll follow the Via Dolorosa, passing many of the traditional 14 Stations of the Cross, retracing the steps of Jesus on His way to Calvary. Along the route, we'll also experience part of the old, colorful oriental market, alive with history and culture. We continue our walk into the restored Jewish Quarter, where we'll explore the Roman Cardo, the main street of ancient Jerusalem during Roman times. Our journey then leads us to Mount Zion to visit the Upper Room, the traditional site of the Last Supper and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. Later, we will visit the Southern Wall excavation site, where Jesus Himself would have trod while entering Herod's Temple, and see the steps where He taught the Scriptures to His followers. After a meaningful day filled with spiritual and historical depth, we'll return to our hotel and reflect on the powerful experiences of the day. (B/L/D)

Day 8 & 9 - Remembering Jesus



Key Places: Gethsemane, Pool of Siloam, House of Caiaphas, Calvary, and the Garden Tomb.

Today is our final day in the Holy Land, and we want to make the most of it. We will begin at the Garden of Gethsemane, where Jesus prayed and was betrayed. There, we'll pause for devotion and prayer in a private garden. Then, we take a walk through the Valley of the Tombs, passing the traditional tombs of Absalom and Ezra. Then we will visit the recently uncovered Pool of Siloam, where Jesus told the blind man to wash and receive his sight. Next, we stop at the House of Caiaphas, where Peter denied Jesus three times. After lunch, we conclude with a visit to Calvary and the Garden Tomb, a peaceful place to remember Christ's crucifixion and resurrection and share in the Lord's Supper. We return to the hotel for dinner. (B/L/D)

As day nine arrives, our memorable journey comes to an end. We will transfer to the airport in Tel Aviv and board the plane for our return flight home. On the way, we can fellowship with our friends and remember the many things we shared together.

General Conditions

DEPOSITS AND PAYMENTS: A deposit of \$300.00 per person is required to reserve space on the tour. An additional payment of \$1500.00 per person is due October 25, 2026. CANCELLATIONS AND REFUNDS: If a passenger cancels his/her tour membership there will be a cancellation fee of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00) per person up until 91 days before departure. For cancellations 90-60 days before departure the cancellation fee will be \$300.00 per person. There will be no refund for cancellations within 59 days of departure, no-shows, or partially completed tours. All cancellation requests must be addressed to TEMPLETON TOURS INC. in writing.

FARE INCLUSIVE: Roundtrip Airfare from Charlotte, NC (CLT) Eight (8) nights hotel accommodations, based on two people sharing a double or twin-bedded room in four-star hotels. All meals as outlined in the brochure consisting of full Israeli breakfasts (B), lunches (L), and table d'hôte dinners at the hotel (D). Sightseeing as outlined in the itinerary by private motorcoaches, utilizing the services of a local English speaking guide. Entrance fees for attractions if applicable. All transfers between airports and hotels by private motorcoach. Service charges and taxes normally levied by hotels and restaurants. All U.S. & Israeli departure taxes are included in the price of the tour. Cancellation fees levied by the airlines are applicable if you cancel or change your air ticket for any reason after purchase of air ticket. Ticketing must be completed 45 days prior to departure. Group fares do not permit deviations; passengers who wish to deviate may arrange their own airfare. An airline credit TBA will be given to those passengers who arrange their own airfare. Passengers planning to arrange their own air transportation must notify TTI in writing on or before October 25, 2026. Seat numbers will be assigned by the airline at check-in; specific seat requests cannot be guaranteed. Passengers are responsible for providing frequent flyer information upon check-in.

HOTELS: Tour prices are per person, based on two people sharing a room. Single rooms are subject to availability and at an additional cost of \$1695. (Tour participants without a roommate will have to pay single room surcharge.)

BAGGAGE ALLOWANCE: One (1) piece of checked luggage whose overall dimensions do not exceed 62 inches (length + width + height) and whose weight does not exceed fifty (50) pounds in total. One (1) piece of carry-on luggage & one personal item (i.e. purse, laptop bag, backpack). Tips to hotel porters are included for one normal sized piece of luggage, excluding carry-on bags which must remain in your possession at all times. Regulations are subject to change without notice. Please read the monthly correspondence from TEMPLETON TOURS for the most current information. Dangerous articles such as firearms, explosives, oxygen, or combustible substances are prohibited in your luggage. Medications, valuables, passports, and a change of clothing should be packed in your carry-on bag.
