Third Sunday of Easter -- In the days and weeks that followed the Resurrection, the risen Lord kept appearing to his disciples when and where they least expected: in a locked room in Jerusalem, on the road to Emmaus, on the shore of the Sea of Tiberias. Each time, it took a while for them to recognize him. We often fail to recognize him as well, even though we know he continues to appear in our midst today. Whether in the person in need, in God's word, in the Eucharist, or in each other, let us be reminded that he continues to offer his presence to us every day.

A STORY OF FAITH, RESILIENCE AND INSPIRATION

My journey as a priest started when I was 6 years old. I grew up from a poor, simple but religious family. It was my mother and grandmother who transmitted the faith and had a great influence on my life. They would bring me to church, were, as a young boy, as they were praying, I was sound asleep on the pew. Later, after my first communion, I became an altar server, then at the age of twelve I entered the seminary. I spent 12 years of seminary formation, until I was ordained at 24 years old, in my hometown, 39 years ago.

For the last 39 years, there were ups and downs, but I would not be in any situation than the priesthood. I am not saying that this is a perfect life for me, I have my share of difficulty, weakness, crisis, frailties but this is where God called me to be. This is the life that God wants me to be. I am happy with my decision; this is the choice that I made. I always see my priesthood as a gift freely given from the Lord. I received this gift, and will always be grateful and acknowledge my unworthiness. I am a man who has been forgiven. In the last 39 years of my life as a priest, I have moments of sin, emptiness, periods of worldliness, yet God has been merciful to me. To quote the late +Pope Francis: "Miserable but chosen." What's next? I count, one day at a time, I am always grateful but unworthy. A sinner like me, but everything is grace! If you happen to read this, please say a little prayer for me. [Fr. Ramon]
