





Catechetical Corner

How to Participate Actively at Mass?

- Active participation at Mass is more than simply being present—it means offering your whole self in worship. The Second Vatican Council reminds us that all the faithful should take part fully, consciously, and actively in the liturgy. This begins with preparation: arriving early, quieting your heart, and reflecting on the readings beforehand.
- During the celebration, sing the hymns, make the responses, and follow the prayers with attention. Listen to the Word of God as though it were spoken directly to you. When the priest lifts up the Eucharist, unite your heart with Christ’s sacrifice and offer your own joys, struggles, and intentions to God.
- After receiving Holy Communion, spend a moment in silent gratitude. Let the grace of the sacrament transform you so that you may live as a witness of Christ in daily life. True participation means not only worshiping with your lips but also allowing the Mass to shape your heart and actions throughout the week.

- November provides an opportunity for the faithful to reflect on mortality, eternal life, and the bonds that transcend this earthly existence. Through our prayers, sacrifices, and acts of charity, we can alleviate the suffering of the souls in purgatory and deepen our relationship with God.

Cómo Participar Activamente en la Misa

- Participar activamente en la Misa es más que solo estar presente; significa ofrecer todo nuestro ser en adoración. El Concilio Vaticano II nos recuerda que todos los fieles deben participar plena, consciente y activamente en la liturgia. Esto comienza con la preparación: llegar con tiempo, guardar silencio interior y reflexionar sobre las lecturas antes de comenzar.
- Durante la celebración, canta los cantos, responde con atención y sigue las oraciones con devoción. Escucha la Palabra de Dios como si te hablara directamente a ti. Cuando el sacerdote eleva la Eucaristía, une tu corazón al sacrificio de Cristo y ofrece tus alegrías, luchas e intenciones a Dios.
- Después de recibir la Comunión, guarda un momento de silencio agradecido. Permite que la gracia del sacramento te transforme para que vivas como testigo de Cristo cada día. La verdadera participación no solo se expresa con los labios, sino dejando que la Misa forme tu corazón y tus acciones durante toda la semana.
