Dear Administrators, Teachers and Students,

Each year, the Mississippi Section of the American Nuclear Society awards up to two **\$1000** scholarships to graduating high-school seniors or current undergraduate students who have an interest in working in a field related to nuclear science and technology. We write you today to help spread the word about this wonderful opportunity.

### What does “nuclear science and technology” include?

- Electricity Generation – Did you know that we have a nuclear reactor right here in Mississippi? Grand Gulf Nuclear Station, located in Port Gibson, MS, is the most powerful single-unit nuclear reactor in the US, and relies on the talents of more than 500 on-site staff. Nuclear power generation includes many more roles than you might think – degreed and non-degreed!
- Medical Applications – Technicians and other specialists are needed to perform nuclear-based diagnostic tests and imaging, and health physicists are needed to ensure the health and safety of those who work with radioactive agents.
- Research – Dive into the world of new materials for nuclear applications; investigate the behavior of subatomic particles; discover new paths toward sustainable fusion. The nuclear research opportunities are endless.

### Who is eligible?

Candidates must be either (1) a graduating senior from a Mississippi high school or (2) an undergraduate student currently enrolled in a Mississippi college. All candidates must enroll, full-time, in college courses in Fall 2025 and must pursue science, mathematics and/or technical courses with an interest in working in nuclear science and technology.
