
#### **FATIMA DAAS**

'An absorbing exploration of sexuality and religion in the mainly Muslim Paris suburb of Clichy-sous-Bois'

The youngest daughter of Algerian immigrants, Fatima Daas is raised in a home where love and sexuality are considered taboo and any expression of affection avoided. Living in the majority-Muslim Clichy-sous-Bois, she often spends more than three hours a day on public transport to and from the city where she feels like a tourist observing Parisian manners. She goes from unstable student to maladjusted adult, doing four years of therapy – her longest relationship. But as she gains distance from her family and comes into her own, she grapples more directly with her attraction to women and how it fits with her religion. When Nina enters Fatima's life, she is not exactly sure what she needs but begins to feel that something crucial has been missing.



FATIMA DAAS (the author's pseudonym) was born in 1995 and grew up in the Parisian banlieue of Clichy-sous-Bois, where her parents settled after arriving from Algeria. In high school, Daas participated in writing workshops led by Tanguy Viel. Well aware of the contradictions, she defines herself as Muslim, feminist and gay.



The novel follows the individual stories of various travellers who embark on the journey from Kingston to London aboard the HMT *Empire Windrush*, exploring the motives and back-stories of these West Indian people, with a fast-paced, powerfully told narrative.

You feel and hear the stories of young men and women from different Caribbean islands before they board HMT *Empire Windrush* – the 'ship of dreams' that would take them to the Motherland with its 'streets paved with gold'. The intertwining stories reveal what happened on board that ship full of excited people, who had never before left their parents, their parishes or their islands.

Through tales of music, fighting, dancing, rum, racism, sex, God, love and laughter, emerges the story of the *Empire Windrush* and her passengers *before* they arrived in England.



Tony Fairweather was born in Clapham South, the son of Jamaican parents. He opened one of the first Black bookshops in the UK, with an art gallery and artefacts. In 1989 he founded 'The Write Thing', an events company established to promote Black authors. Tony is the founder and curator of the Windrush Collection and the Windrush Exhibition of artefacts associated with the Windrush generation. He lives in South London.



A satirical exploration of Caribbean and British transatlantic historical connections.

In the title story, Inspector Dreadlock Holmes and his partner Rudeyard Fly are sent for by the Criminal Investigation Department of Middleham-by-Sea – a small town known for tea shops, pet shops, florist shops – in short, a rustic retreat for naughty weekends. Keen to kickstart their diversity policy, the Department sends for two black law enforcers, who both think this an opportunity too good to miss: a chance to prove their cross-cultural mettle and elucidate the brutal attack on Lord Montagu.

Surreal and playful, John Agard's stories also reveal hidden truths that subtly change our view of how we are and where we come from. His tongue-in-cheek short stories send up imperial myths, unravelling the idea of what it means to be English.



Poet, performer, anthologist and prose writer, John Agard was born in Guyana in 1949 and came to Britain in 1977. John Agard's awards include the Casas de las Americas Prize (Cuba), the 1997 Paul Hamlyn Award for Poetry, the Cholmondeley Award in 2004 and the Queens's Gold Medal for Poetry in 2012. In 2021, John was awarded the BookTrust's Lifetime Achievement Award. Inspector Dreadlock Holmes and Other Stories is his first collection of fiction for adults.

Mwana is a young man from Bantuland, currently living in Geneva, having moved to Switzerland a few years earlier. Mwana lost his sales job and is struggling to find work. He has one foot in each culture. He sees Swiss society through African eyes, with all its contradictions: its moderation, stunning landscapes and its trains (not always on time) and its eccentricities, but also its intolerance and inflexibility. Having become a little Swiss from living there for some years, he casts a critical eye on his native Africa and on the weight of its traditions and beliefs in the eponymous Bantu Trinity with all of its excesses.



MAX LOBE was born in Douala, Cameroon. At eighteen he moved to Switzerland, where he earned a BA in Communication and Journalism and a Master's in Public Policy and Administration. In 2017, his novel *Confidences* won the Ahmadou Kourouma Prize. Other books by the author include *39 rue de Berne*, and *A Long Way From Douala* (published by HopeRoad in 2021). Max Lobe lives in Geneva.




REHAN KHAN was born in London.

Inspired by his favourite teacher, Mr 'Easy' Easton, Naz escapes from a reality he has little control over by reading books. But with the onset of adolescence, new possibilities start to arise, and he sets out on a journey of discovery.

With new friends and interests – fashion, music, girls – he begins to taste a freedom he's never known. As Naz moves further away from his family, conflict becomes inevitable.


# DREAM LIKE ME: SOUTH ASIAN FOOTBALL TRAILBLAZERS MANISHA TAILOR


# THE BLACK AND WHITE MUSEUM FERDINAND DENNIS


Jeremy Cameron - Author of the Nicky Burkett Seies


# EXHUMATION LEENA DHINGRA
