

This guidance is for all users of Altham Terrace Scout Campsite to ensure safe, respectful, and efficient use of our limited access and parking facilities. Please read carefully before arriving on site.

Access to Altham Terrace

- Altham Terrace is a narrow, single-lane road running alongside the Catchwater Drain.
- There are two key passing points:
 1. Near the entrance to the Scout Campsite
 2. At the junction of Altham Terrace and Hall Drive
- Please drive slowly, give way to pedestrians, cyclists, and dog walkers, and use the passing points responsibly.
- Be particularly cautious when turning into or out of the campsite entrance.

Site Entrance and Track

- The track into the campsite is single carriageway.
- Entering vehicles have priority to avoid reversing back onto the main road.
- Vehicles leaving the site should wait, move aside, or reverse into the car park to allow entry.
- Always be vigilant for young people, pedestrians, and other vehicles.

Young People and Vehicle Safety

- All site users must instruct their young people to:
 - Avoid entering or playing in parking and driving areas.
 - Approach parked cars only with supervision and awareness.
- Vehicle movements must be kept to a minimum during sessions or events.

Parking Guidance



Primary Parking Area – Car Park (Green Area)

- All vehicles should first park in the designated car park area (see green area on map).
- Reverse park only to ensure quick and safe evacuation if needed.
- Drivers must check surroundings before moving vehicles.
- Young people must avoid the car park unless arriving or departing under supervision.

Secondary Overflow Parking – Campsite Access (Yellow Lines/Area)

When the car park is full:

1. Follow the yellow route through the bollards onto the campsite.
2. Drive slowly along the right-hand side of the bollards.
3. Loop around the rear of the Cathedral building.
4. Park:
 - Behind the Cathedral building, between it and the water building.
 - Or along the fence line behind the Cathedral.

A designated leader must act as a Marshall during this time to manage safety and supervise all movement while vehicles are active.

Tertiary Overflow Parking – Campsite Perimeter (Blue Area)

If both green and yellow areas are full:

- Additional parking is permitted:
 - Along the fence line beside the horse paddock.
 - At the rear of the campsite, next to the allotments.
- All vehicles must reverse park, remain alert, and drive at walking speed.
- No vehicles should block access to campfire circles or campsite.

Long-Term Vehicle Parking

If you intend to leave a vehicle on site for an extended period (e.g. during a residential, hike, or expedition):

- The vehicle must be parked to the rear of the Cathedral building, not in the main car park.
- You must inform the Booking Secretary, Jennifer Hetherington-Field, in advance to confirm and approve parking arrangements.

Vehicles left without prior agreement may be considered abandoned and may be removed or reported.
