



When you win a game, achieve an athletic goal, shine in a performance, or break a record, your natural response as a competitor is to want the credit and whatever reward is attached to that success. Another way you might describe it is "glory," which can come in the form of recognition, renown, prestige, fame, or honor.

There's nothing inherently wrong in desiring good outcomes from your hard work. But if that's your number one goal as a competitor, it will never be as fulfilling as you hope it might be. You'll always be tempted to chase your own glory if you don't understand your true identity and purpose.

WORKOUT

The miraculous story of Creation can be found in the first two chapters of Genesis. But God wanted more than to admire the beauty of His workmanship. Something was missing. On the sixth day, God created man and woman so He could enjoy fellowship with someone like Him. And He didn't hold back in His design.

Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, according to our likeness." - Genesis 1:26a

In a time when physical appearance is such a dominant part of culture, it's incredible to know that every person born (including you) was created in God's image because of His great love for humankind.

- How much do you think about your outward image as a competitor or elsewhere in your daily life?
- How does knowing you're made in God's image impact how you view yourself and how much thought you should put into how others view you?

FOR HIS GLORY

When God created Adam and Eve, He also gave them a purpose for their existence. Beyond a personal relationship, they were made to populate the earth and steward its resources. Ultimately, God created people to bring Him glory.

Like Adam and Eve, you, too, were created in God's image. And just like them, you were created for a great purpose. As Isaiah 43:7 says, you were created for His glory.

That means God made you as a testament to His greatness, creativity, power, sovereignty, and perfection. In other words, God created you to reflect the essence of His glorious nature and being, which is infinitely greater than any purpose you could desire.

- What do you think are some of your primary purposes in life?
- How might embracing the truth that you are created for God's glory change the way you approach competition?


If you're struggling with the concepts of identity (knowing who you are) and purpose (knowing why you are here), you need to remember that you are:

- Created In His Image: You are who God meant you to be. His perfect love was behind every part of your unique design.
 - o So God created man in his own image; He created him in the image of God; He created them male and female. Genesis 1:27
- Created For His Glory: You were made for a purpose. The most important reason you exist is to show others who God is through all aspects of your life.
 - Our Lord and God, you are worthy to receive glory and honor and power because you have created all things, and by your will, they exist and were created. Revelation 4:11

As you better understand your God-given identity and purpose, you will start to move from chasing your glory to reflecting His glory.

KEY ACTION

Reflect on how questions about your identity and purpose have driven you as a competitor. Be prepared to hear from the Holy Spirit through his word as God's great love and divine purpose for you are made clear.

This last year, they had 63 student Huddle leaders evangelizing across campus and within their teams, covering 19 sports and discipling over 200 students! Malone University's FCA Huddle has a unique position on their campus. As a Christian university, students must earn 15
Spiritual Formation Credits per semester by attending oncampus ministries. With half of the student body composed of athletes who came to the university with no religious intent, FCA is an appealing spiritual opportunity for these students to gain these credits. For that reason, attendance at the Huddle has been strong, and conversations with athletes can last long after the Huddle ends for the night. These students are spiritually hungry, and we are thankful for the 18 student-athlete leaders covering 12 sports, each leading Bible studies and discipling teammates. God is certainly moving on this campus!



UNIVERSITY OF MOUNT UNION



The University of Mount Union's FCA Huddle continues to thrive and grow, often seeing spikes in attendance far over their 100 average. This last year, they had 5 dedicated student leaders, covering 4 sports and discipling approximately 50 students in their small groups. Additionally, they witnessed 24 student baptisms in the last year! Yet, even without these numbers, what's really exciting about this huddle is how sincere they are in deepening their faith! More than ever, it seems, they are willing to face their sin, confess to each other, forgive one another, and pray together. You don't need numbers to tell you that the Spirit is working among these college students!

As servants of God and shepherds of the flock entrusted to us, the Fellowship of Christian Athletes Staff eagerly work to establish Huddles at new schools, but all our effort would amount to nothing if it were not for the faithfulness, presence, and service of our Huddle leaders. This year, we want to highlight one of our amazing leaders who makes this ministry possible – Joe Combs at Smithville High School.

It does not take a long encounter to realize that Joe Combs is one of those people who you constantly want to be around in hopes that some of his passionate energy for the Lord will rub off on you. We have often made "jokes" that we need him on our FCA staff because of how dedicated he is to the cause of Christ through the influence of coaches and athletes. The times are few when Joe Combs' name is brought up in conversation and no one says in wonder, "he's awesome!"

In Romans 13:11-12, Paul writes, "And do this, understanding the present time: The hour has already come for you to wake up from your slumber, because our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed. The night is nearly over; the day is almost here."

Why does Joe so commonly elicit such a reaction? There are two phrases that sum up the reason: "passionate service" and "glory to God." It is Joe's thrilling passion for the Lord and his initiative to obey God's command to make disciples that seems to catch fire even within those who merely speak with him. Just as 1 Peter 5:2 instructs, Joe's heart beats in tune with our Chief Shepherd's, eagerly seeking to introduce the lost to Christ and guide fellow brothers- and sisters-in-Christ along the Way. Joe's persistent activity is not the result of manmade determination and works but of his overflowing love for the Lord and for his neighbor. Because of this, he often comes to us with ideas on how to reach more people with the Gospel message. And he is not just a visionary. He is also a voyager, taking the steps to make every God-given vision a Spirit-led reality.

Joe not only comes alongside pre-existing ministry opportunities, such as leading the Smithville Huddle and volunteering at our All-Abilities camp with his whole family, but he also has been the originator of multiple other ministry avenues. He was the visionary of our Mission FCA event for starting and training FCA Huddles, the spearhead for our inaugural FCA Fields of Faith in Smithville, and the developer and leader for our first regional Coaches Huddle available to any and every coach. Believe it or not, the last three of those ministry opportunities were accomplished just this last year!

Joe Combs seems to embody the heart of constant service to the Lord. So, we must ask ourselves: is my passion for Christ fueling my mission, or am I growing weary and barely pushing forward in my own strength? Am I following through on my passion for Christ, stepping forward as a voyager with Him? Or am I merely playing the role of an idle visionary who dreams up fantastic things for God but allows the wolves to do the "watching" and working for me?

As sinners saved by God, we all want to bring Him glory, so let us follow the example of our brother-in-Christ and remember that the Lord has called us to go for His glory. He has called us to be faithful shepherds of the flock entrusted to us, to share the Good News of how He has saved us and to train our fellow believers to follow the Way as devoted disciples. Let us not hesitate for a moment longer, for "the night is nearly over; the day is almost here."

Holy Spirit, we are ready shepherds, eager to do Your will. Fill our hearts with such an overwhelming passion for You and Your people that we will be spurred on to action. Let us wake up from our slumber and take action today so that we may soon joyfully watch our flocks enter Heaven's Gate and so share in Your Glory. Amen.


