- We pride ourselves on being a family friendly congregation and have engaged the help of Ping (currently a University Student) to assist with care and activities in our Sunday School Room found in the north hall of the building, behind the kitchen with additional access to the north hall from the doors at the front of the sanctuary. Following the story time, Ping takes the children to the Sunday School Room.

Parents/grandparents/caregivers are welcome to join your little person if they are feeling apprehensive and please know they are under excellent care with Ping. Feel free to check on them during the service. There is also an activity table set up in the sanctuary near the AV equipment and you are welcome to utilize that space as well. A

change station is located in the accessible washroom found in the west hall of the building. There are juice boxes and snacks always available. When we host communion, all ages are invited to the table. We appreciate young people joining in our services and understand that they are learning the lay of the land as they go. Please don't feel uncomfortable as they are finding their way and feel free to move with them to attend to their needs.

Acknowledgement of the Territorial Land and What We Believe ~ Doug

Our pledge is to care for this land as a symbol of our desire to walk with Indigenous peoples in a spirit of reconciliation and respect.

Dale grew up in Lansing United after WW II. Dale (ZE) was Confirmed on January 8, 1956. Dale taught Sunday School and participated in all the Youth activities. The call to ministry was first felt during those years of growth. Teaching Elementary school, raising a family and volunteering in various positions in the church communities filled all of Dale's time, until the opportunity for further education presented itself. Dale graduated from Emmanuel College and was ordained in May 1988 by Toronto Conference. ZE has served 5 congregations in 3 Conferences. Dale last served full time at Covenant United Church in Timmins, ON. Retired for several years, Dale (ZE) continued to offer leadership in many places and congregations in Manitou Conference including the Manitou Conference United Church Women. Dale moved to North York in the fall of 2021 for Cochlear Implant surgery.
