
# FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH ROCK HILL, SC SEPTEMBER 2025





Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ!

In the eleventh chapter of Deuteronomy we read:

"<sup>18</sup>You shall put these words of mine in your heart and soul, and you shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and fix them as an emblem on your forehead. <sup>19</sup> Teach them to your children, talking about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise. <sup>20</sup> Write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates, <sup>21</sup> so that your days and the days of your children may be multiplied in the land that the Lord swore to your ancestors to give them, as long as the heavens are above the earth." - Deuteronomy 11:18-21

Here God is instructing the Israelites of the importance of learning and teaching His word. First, they are instructed to "put" God's word in their heart and soul. God wants His word to become a part of them. Once the word of God was in their heart, they were to teach God's word to the next generation. This instruction was not just to happen when convenient but at anytime and anywhere possible. While this might have caused a hardship, God did include a promise: those who learn and teach God's ways will prosper.

As those who are engrafted into the covenant, this command and promise is for us. God wants us to put His word into our heart and soul. We often use that phrase to explain how something has become a part of us. God wants his word to become like the air we breathe. We hear a similar instruction in the New Testament: "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly." - Colossians 3:16.

Once we allow the Word to dwell in us, we are to teach that Word to the next generation: in the morning, in the evening, when we are home, and when we are away. If we do this, we are promised that our days and our children's days will be multiplied. When we so mold ourselves to the will of God, we will prosper and experience abundant life.

There are many different ways that we can put God's word in our soul and let it dwell richly in our heart. One easy way is to participate in one of our church school classes on Sunday mornings. All you have to do is decide to come an hour earlier than the 11 a.m. service. We have three adult classes, and all are welcoming to new participants. Just one hour out of your entire week can help put the word in your heart.

Another way is to get involved in a small group study. The men of the church are starting a study on Wednesday evenings at 6:30 pm beginning September 10th here at the church. They will be using a book called "Moses: In the Footsteps of the Reluctant Prophet by Adam Hamilton." Study books will soon be available in the Church Office. (Requested donation of \$10/book.) Please contact Terry Dodge for more information

Our women's Fall Bible Study will begin on Tuesday morning September 9th at 10 a.m. and will continue through October 21st. They will be using the book "Acts: Awakening to God in Everyday Life" by Melissa Spoelstra. Study books are available in the Church Office. (Requested donation of \$10/book.)

Another way you can put God's word in your heart to is to form a micro-group of three people where you agree to meet once a week for an hour for study and prayer. A number of folks did the micro-group study on Philippians last fall. If you are interested in doing a trio group this fall, invite two people to join you. Then come see me, and I will get you some material and train the group.

All of these avenues provide the opportunity to soak in the word of God and allow it to become a part of your DNA. I highly encourage you to make it a priority this year to nourish your soul and allow God to mold you more into the image of Christ!


We are excited to see what God brings forth from the participant's minds and hearts as we focus our efforts to "go and see" what God has done in Jesus Christ!



# What is Milestone Ministry?

Many years ago, our Session adopted a Milestone Ministry framework for the educational ministries at FPC. This allows our children to develop strong foundations at every age and build upon them as they grow.

This year, all of our children, youth, and the Crossroads Sunday School classes will have a lesson centered around the same person or event in Scripture. This will allow our families to have conversations centered around the morning's Scripture lesson. In addition, our families will be encouraged to memorize a verse of Scripture whose theme will resonate with the lessons.

Our children and youth will begin together in the Gaston Room at 10:00 am for a focus on Biblical literacy as we learn together more about how the Bible is organized and become familiar finding Scripture passages. Then our classes will meet in their classrooms beginning at 10:15 am. We will also not have Sunday School for these classes on the Sunday's of a holiday weekend. When these classes are not meeting, childcare will be available in the Younger PKs classroom at 10:00 am.

In each month's newsletter, we will publish the current month and next month's Lessons.






