Rise Against Hunger Update: The meals that we packaged in August are headed to the Philippines! The Philippines faces near constant threats of natural disasters like earthquakes, typhoons and volcanic eruptions. These disasters cause displacement and major loss of livelihoods and infrastructure, and disproportionately affect poor communities in rural areas, where people rely on agriculture and fishing. The Global Hunger Index categorizes the Philippines as having a "moderate" level of hunger overall. Rise Against Hunger partners with organizations that support educational programs by providing meals to children at schools and early child development centers. The meals you packaged will help ensure that children have access to the consistent nourishment they need to live healthy lives and successfully pursue their education.


