Bedrails Management Awareness Training Course (1.5 Hours)



Course Brief

The use of bed rails is associated with several direct and indirect risks to bed occupants, as well as the possible benefits from reducing the risk of falls. Direct hazards include entrapment and entanglement, either within gaps in the rails themselves, between the rails and the mattress or between the rails and the bed frame. In the most serious cases, this has led to asphyxiation and death of bed occupants. Bed occupants may have trapped their head between rails or been unable to free themselves from a position and suffered postural asphyxiation. Severe limb damage has also been reported in cases where someone has become entangled in bed rails.

This course will give learners an overview of the current guidance on managing and using bed rails safely, including assessing if a bed rail is necessary and appropriate, and the correct fitting and positioning of bed rails.




