# **Stewardship Emphasis**

This year our theme is "What Shall We Bring?" Yes, we will talk about money, but at the end of the day, what God wants from us is not our stuff, but our "whole heart". Bulls numbering in the thousands and running rivers of oil are not the sacrifice that God desires, but rather our willingness to abandon all other loyalties and claims that clamor for our attention, in favor of one: God. A commitment that does not get measured by the gold standard of empire's wealth, but rather one of the simple turning of life

toward the priorities of the Realm. Do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with God. Seems so simple, but we know the opposite to be true.

Stewardship is about more than money. It is a whole life response to the abundant generosity of God. A generosity that is gauged by more than what we hold in our bank accounts. Stewardship is about the care and management of creation, the observation of Sabbath, and the care for the precious gift that is our own life. It is about sharing the Good News of the gospel by inviting others to join us at an always expanding table of grace. Faithful stewardship is about the intentional and impactful deployment of our spiritual gifts. And yes, it is also about our stuff. It is a way of giving that flows from our heart in concrete ways in response to what God has already done.

It is also about our stuff. We cannot forget, the Bible is concerned about money at two basic levels: First, our relationship with money (and what it can provide); Second, how we use what moves through our sphere of influence toward advancing the principles of the Kingdom of God. Do we use what we have been given to make a difference or to make ourselves more comfortable? Do we own our stuff, or is it the other way around? In the end it is about what we bring to




# Two Adult Sunday School Options

As a Volunteer Reader, you will:


- Read with a child one-on-one or an entire classroom in an elementary school or PreK program.

## KARYN'S KWIPS...

Beginning the Sunday after Round Up I began a four-day study leave. I had been putting some books aside to read during these days. I was able to read thirteen of the books that I had put aside (I saved two for my Spiritual Retreat at the beach October 3-5). I thought I would share a little bit about the books that I read.

"Disciples – Who We Are & What Holds Us Together" – In January I will be offering a class on our denomination, Christian Church – Disciples of Christ. I read this book to help form this class.

"Reclaiming Rural" – This book talks about the gifts of rural churches and the dangers of trying to use "known" and "historical" models of ministry in current rural settings.

"The Flawed Family of God" – The author of this book writes honestly about the examples of imperfect families in the book of Genesis, and the lessons we can take from them.

"It Didn't Start With You – How Inherited Family Trauma Shapes Who We Are and How to End the Cycle" – This book looks at how traumas from generations before us are brought into our lives today.

"Open and Relational Theology" – Provides a way to look at God that might be helpful for those struggling with their image of God

"The Gospel of Mark" – Amy Jill Levine's new commentary/small group resource

"Badass Women of the Bible" – A small group study on often overlooked females in the Biblical stories.

"Short Stories by Jesus" and "Scandalous Stories of Jesus" – I will be using perspectives from these books in a sermon series on The Parables in early 2024.

"The Call" - A book about Paul's ministry that I plan to use is a sermon series after Easter 2024.

"Colors of Hope" – A Devotional/small group study from LBGTQ+ Christians, mostly within our denomination.

"Holy Chaos – Creating Connections in Divisive Times" – As we enter into a very divisive political season this book provides possibilities that could help our community.

"Fear Not – Living Grace and Truth in a Fragmented World" – A small group resource to help us live as people of faith in what feels like more fearful times.

I am grateful to have had this time of study to read these books. I am looking forward to incorporating things from them into my ministry.

#### Marc's Remarks

I love to people watch. In fact, among some of my favorite memories of dates with Wendy (prior to our marriage in 1979) were evenings spent at the Seattle-Tacoma International Airport watching people come and go from any number of the gates inside the terminal. That was at a time long before the existence of TSA when anyone could go, with or without a plane ticket, and sit near any of the gates throughout the entire airport. Wendy and I sometimes would sit for hours, beverages in hand, dreaming of times when we, too, could fly to any number of exotic places.

I suppose that's one of the reasons I've enjoyed the Pendleton Round Up. Besides the experience of attending the rodeo or perusing the various venues up and down Main Street, I appreciate the opportunities I get to sit and watch people come and go. Sometimes I'll engage in conversation with someone I've just met. It's fascinating to meet and talk with people who are from different parts of the country and even the world.

When I think of Round Up as I've experienced it since moving to Pendleton twenty years ago, my thoughts turn to heaven and what it might be like in times yet to come. Oh, I know... the Pendleton Round Up and "heaven" are two vastly different concepts, so comparing them isn't necessarily straightforward. Bear with me, though, as I share some additional thoughts.

Those of us who are from Pendleton know that the Round Up is one of the oldest rodeos in the United States and, like any rodeo, features various events such as bull riding, barrel racing, steer roping, and more. It's a significant cultural event in our region where people from various places come to celebrate the heritage of the American West and cowboy culture.

Heaven, comparatively, is generally depicted as a place of eternal happiness, peace, and the afterlife where people go after they pass away. The specific beliefs about heaven vary among different religions and cultures, but in the Christian tradition it's often associated with eternal life in the presence of the Creator God. It is where God's presence is fully manifest, and people are in close communion with God. Heaven is often depicted as a place of perfect love, joy, and peace.

Comparing Pendleton Round Up to heaven is like comparing apples to oranges because they belong to entirely different realms. The Pendleton Round Up is a real-world event that people attend for sport and entertainment, while heaven is a metaphysical and often deeply personal belief. Nonetheless, I imagine that I'll get to experience the thrill of watching people in heaven someday, much the same as I enjoy it in this life! Of course, I look most forward to seeing people in heaven I've known who have predeceased me in this lifetime. I'm sure that reunion will be unlike any that has taken place here on this earth!
