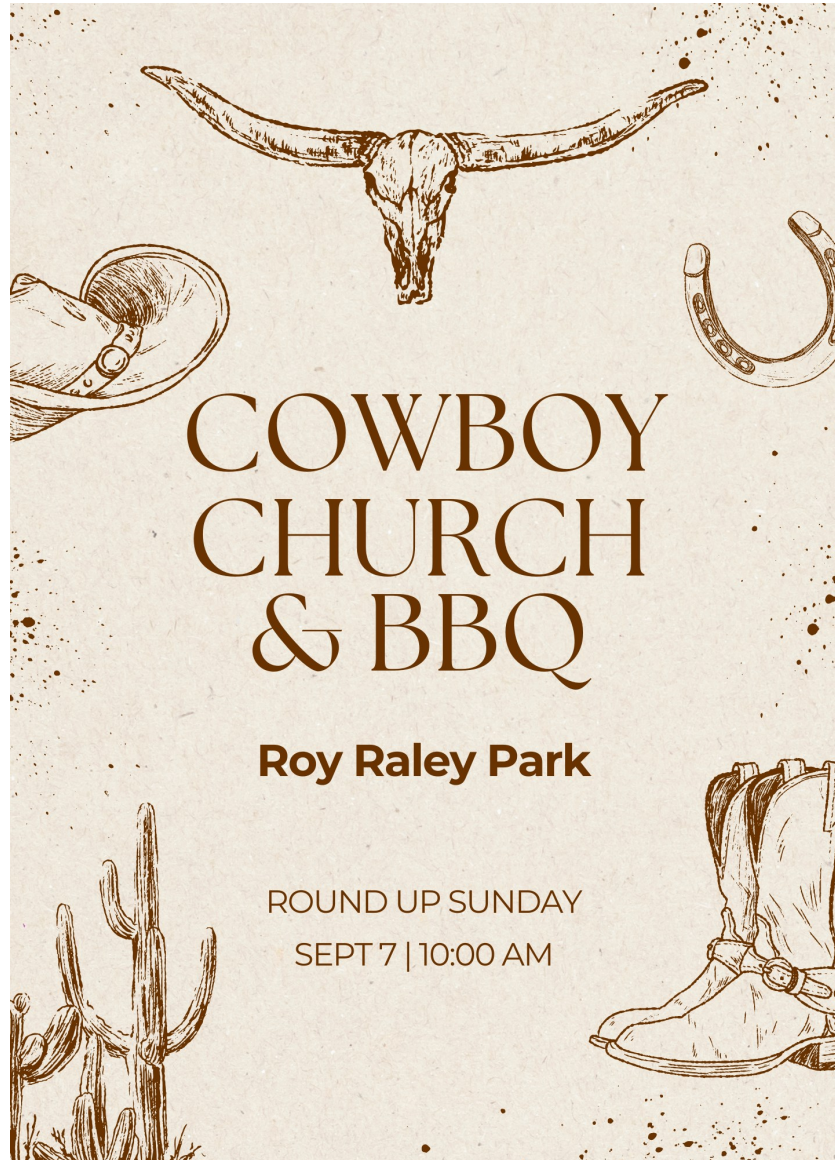

CWF will meet in October.

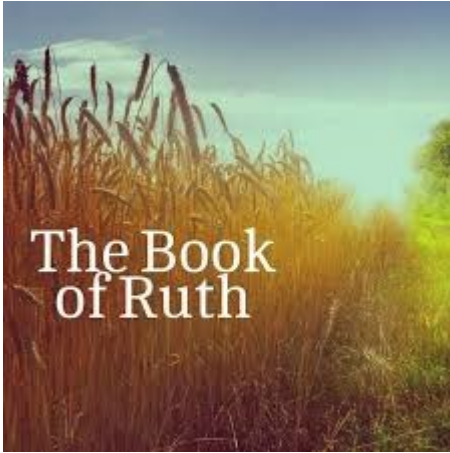
