Story time is one of the many services the library provides to help entertain and inspire the young minds of the county. If you have young children at home, check our website to learn more about story time and our other great offerings!



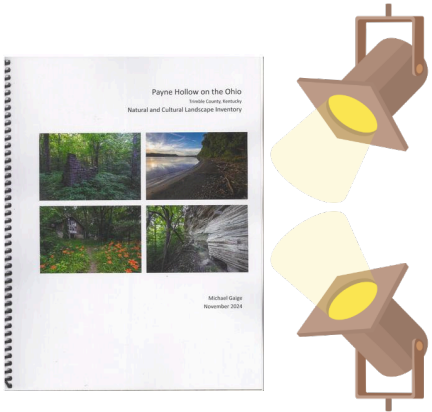
Get Involved: Friends of the Library

Book Spotlight: Payne Hollow on the Ohio

Payne Hollow is perhaps the most fascinating historical site in Trimble County, but its intrigue stems from more than just its connection to Harlan and Anna Hubbard. This ecological survey of Payne Hollow by Michael Gaige forms and communicates a natural history dating from when the land was as the Hubbards knew it to thousands of years before they had even been born.

In this record you will find many kinds of maps that span the hollow, cultural insights, photos of the hollow's uniquely interesting flora and landscapes, details on the Hubbards' house and studio, a history of the land itself and its ownership, and more, all interspersed by relevant quotes about the land from Harlan Hubbard's journal. This natural and cultural inventory is now available for checkout at the Trimble County Public Library.
