What's a Typical Day at Camp Quest look like?

Camp Quest Hours – Monday – Friday

Camp Quest Hours – 7:30am to 5:30pm

Camp Quest provides a safe and positive environment for Club members to participate in healthy, developmentally appropriate activities and experiential learning opportunities. Our day at the Club focuses on having fun while learning, building self-esteem, and social-skills through hands-on activities. Weekly activities and day trips keep Club members engaged and provide a basis for members to learn about themselves and the world around them. We provide many opportunities for your child to have a fun (and safe!) summer.

A typical day consists of several planned hands-on activities throughout the day, including athletics, STEM, outdoor activities, gardening, arts & crafts, wellness activities, enrichment experiences and special events.

We are out of the building on Monday, Wednesday and Friday for day trips. Tuesday and Thursday are full in-building days for the camp session.

Swimming

This summer, members will have the opportunity to swim at Rockwell Park Pool and Page Park Pool. Due to the number of children in the program and to ensure we are maintaining OEC ratios, the camp will be separated into four groups of 10 participants. Groups will predominately be separated by grade but will be modified as needed.

Camp Quest participants are required to wear field trip shirts on all day trips, including water trips. Each child will be wearing a swim bracelet indicating their swim level. Please ensure your child brings their bathing suit, towel, sneakers, and sunscreen/bug spray.



Meal Program

The Boys & Girls Club of Bristol partners with Bristol Public Schools to offer meals to any child under the age of 18 participating in Camp Quest. During registration, you will have the ability to indicate whether your child needs the provided breakfast, lunch, or both meals. If you do not indicate that your child needs to participate in the meal program during the registration process for that week, we may not be able to provide a meal(s) for your child as only a specific number of meals are delivered to each site based on allergies, are picky eaters or have dietary restrictions to bring their own food, as we cannot guarantee that all meals are allergen free.

Please note, there is potential for situations where there is no opportunity to heat or warm up food, nor is there refrigeration available, so please plan lunches accordingly. We set up an allergen free table for any child with allergies. However, should certain foods be prohibited due to an airborne allergy, parents/guardians will be notified in advance.

What Do Bring Each Day

Your child should bring the following items with them daily:

- Backpack
- Water bottle
- Field Trip Shirts (M/W/F)
- Lunch and Snack
- Bathing Suit/Towel (M/F)
- Sneakers (Shoes with backs!)
- Sunscreen / Bug Spray

What to Keep at Home

- All electronic devices
- Collectable Items / Memorabilia
- Toys



Lost & Found

The Boys & Girls Club of Bristol is not responsible for lost, broken, or stolen items.

We encourage Club members to learn to be responsible for their own belongings. Any left behind items left after the day ends will be brought to the front main entrance of the Club and placed in the *Lost & Found Container*. If it has a name, we will attempt to get it back to the owner. All items not collected by August 21st will be donated or discarded.

Children in Summer School

If your child will be attending summer school, please notify the leadership team of Camp Quest. It is important that we are informed of the specific days and times your child will be dropped off and picked up from our program.

Please be advised that on scheduled day trip days, BBGC staff will not remain at the Club. As a result, we will be unable to receive children from the bus on those days, and alternative care arrangements must be made. Kindly note that payment is required for all contracted services, regardless of your child's attendance.

Permission Slips and Waivers – Urban Air

WAIVER, RELEASE, AND INDEMNIFICATION AGREEMENT

PLEASE READ THIS DOCUMENT CAREFULLY. BY SIGNING, YOU ARE GIVING UP LEGAL RIGHTS

This Waiver, Release, and Indemnification Agreement (Agreement) is entered into by the Adult Participant, and if any minor is named below, the Adult Participant on behalf of and as parent or legal guardian for the Child Participant(s) in favor of Fun R Us Adventures Waterbury Incorporated (Snapology and Urban Air). Collectively and severally, Adult Participant and Child Participant are referred to as the Participant. In consideration of Snapology and Urban Air permitting Participant access to the Premises and the ability to participate in the Activities herein defined, including the Activities which may occur in, about, or near 425 Banks St., Waterbury, CT 06708 or any other premises owned or operated by Snapology and Urban Air wherever located (Premises), Participant agrees as follows:

1. NATURE OF THE ACTIVITIES. Snapology offers curriculum-based programs, events, and workshops for children and adults using LEGO® brand bricks, K’Nex® brand toys, their substitutes, other building toys and components thereto; robotics, animation, coding, and engineering techniques all inside an Urban Air Adventure Park. Urban Air offers Participants (a) the opportunity to participate actively or passively, in trampoline and adventure park related activities, including, but not limited to, jumping, dodgeball, volleyball, tumbling, foam pit jumping, aerobics, skydiving, ninja warrior course, battle beam, laser tag, soft play, ropes course, climbing wall, roller coaster/sky rider, go carts, laser tag, bowling, bumper cars, cyber sports, mini golf, arcades, exercising, and other miscellaneous trampoline and adventure activities, instruction, training, events, and programs (b) access to Snapology curriculum-based programs, events, and workshops (c) access to the Premises, and Café. The activities described in this paragraph are referred to herein as the Activities.

2. TYPES OF RISKS.

2.1 Risks Associated with Snapology Activities. Participant acknowledges there are inherent risks in and injuries which may occur from participating in the Activities, including, but not limited to, choking due to swallowing LEGO® brand bricks, K’Nex® brand toys, their substitutes, other building toys and components thereto; broken or chipped teeth; physical bodily obstructions or other unknown injuries due to improper placement of LEGO® brand bricks, K’Nex® brand toys, their substitutes, other building toys and components thereto in ears, nostrils, mouths and other external body orifices; electrical shock while using electrical components used in conjunction with LEGO® brand bricks, K’Nex® brand toys, their substitutes, other building toys and components thereto; lacerations, contusions and punctures; physical or emotional injuries resulting from negligent, reckless and intentional use or weaponization of LEGO® brand bricks, K’Nex® brand toys, their substitutes, other building toys and components thereto. Due to the nature of the Activities, there are more hazards and risks than the foregoing, and there are also unknown and unforeseeable hazards. If you have any questions, please contact a manager.

2.2 Risks Associated with Urban Air Activities. Participant acknowledges there are inherent risks in and injuries which may occur from participating in the Activities, including, but not limited to, equipment malfunction; defective design or manufacture of equipment; improper or negligent installation of equipment; negligent maintenance of equipment; cuts; bruises; muscle strain; twisted or sprained ankles, knees, shoulders, or wrists; burns; dirt or other materials in eye; concussions; broken bones; physical or emotional injuries; landing wrong; over-exertion; failure of the attraction surface or attachments; being hit by a ball; collisions with other participants; erratic co-participant behavior; collisions with standards and supports; using improper form or technique; slipping, falling, or tripping; equipment failure; error of judgment by employees; paralysis, disability, or death; personal injury to third persons; or property damage. When skydiving, the most common risk of injury is to the shoulders due to the force of the air on them. When



participating in cyber or e-sports, the most common risk of injury is a seizure due to epilepsy. Due to the nature of the Activities, there are more hazards and risks than the foregoing, and there are also unknown and unforeseeable hazards. If you have any questions, please contact a manager before purchasing admission.

2.3 Exposure to Bacteria, Fungus, Virus and Unknown Contagious Diseases. By entering the Premises or when engaging in the Activities, there is a risk of exposure to bacteria, fungi, viruses, unknown contagious diseases, and COVID-19, which notwithstanding governmental recommendations and the practices of Snapology and Urban Air, cannot be eliminated. **CONSEQUENTLY, TO THE FULLEST EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, PARTICIPANT KNOWINGLY AND FULLY ASSUMES THE RISK OF, RELEASES, AND SHALL INDEMNIFY SNAPOLOGY AND URBAN AIR FROM ALL CLAIMS (AS DEFINED IN SECTION 5 BELOW) OR BODILY INJURY RESULTING FROM PARTICIPANT'S EXPOSURE TO ANY BACTERIA, FUNGUS, VIRUS, OR UNKNOWN CONTAGIOUS DISEASES IN ANY WAY CONNECTED TO PARTICIPANT'S ENTRY INTO THE PREMISES OR ENGAGEMENT IN THE ACTIVITIES. FURTHER, ADULT PARTICIPANT ON BEHALF OF HIM/HERSELF AND THAT OF THE CHILD PARTICIPANT(S) CONSENTS TO HAVING THEIR TEMPERATURE TAKEN BY SNAPOLOGY AND/OR URBAN AIR AND ACKNOWLEDGES THEY MAY BE DENIED ACCESS TO OR FORCED TO VACATE THE PREMISES IF THEY EVIDENCE SYMPTOMS OF EXPOSURE TO BACTERIA, FUNGUS, VIRUSES, OR UNKNOWN CONTAGIOUS DISEASES AS IDENTIFIED BY THE CENTER FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION.**

3. ASSUMPTION OF RISKS. Notwithstanding the foregoing risks and safety measures implemented by Snapology and Urban Air, Participant acknowledges it is impossible to eliminate all risk of injury and understands the demands of the Activities relative to Participant's physical condition and skill level. **PARTICIPANT AFFIRMS PARTICIPATION IN THE ACTIVITIES IS VOLUNTARY AND PARTICIPANT KNOWINGLY, WITH UNDERSTANDING OF THE RISKS AND POTENTIAL INJURIES, ASSUMES ALL RISKS INHERENT WITH THE ACTIVITIES AND ACCESS TO THE PREMISES.**

4. ALCOHOL. Participant agrees to exercise ordinary and reasonable care and to not consume alcohol to the extent Participant's judgment is impaired. Participant understands the potential risks associated with the consumption of alcohol and acknowledges Participant does not have and is not aware of any medical condition that would result in any injury to Participant due to Participant's consumption of alcohol. Participant assumes the risks associated with alcohol consumption and takes full responsibility for Participant's own actions, safety, and welfare. **UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES WILL PARTICIPANT BE ALLOWED TO PARTICIPATE IN ANY ACTIVITIES IF PARTICIPANT HAS CONSUMED ALCOHOL.**

5. RELEASE AND INDEMNITY. **TO THE FULLEST EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, ADULT PARTICIPANT ON BEHALF OF HIMSELF, CHILD PARTICIPANT, AND THEIR HEIRS, EXECUTORS, AND REPRESENTATIVES RELEASES, AGREES NOT TO SUE, AND SHALL INDEMNIFY AND DEFEND SNAPOLOGY, THE SNAPOLOGY FRANCHISOR, URBAN AIR, THE URBAN AIR FRANCHISOR, THE LEGAL OWNER OF THE PREMISES, THE LANDLORD, MORTGAGEES AND MANAGEMENT COMPANY OF THE PREMISES, AND ANY OF THEIR LENDERS, PARENTS, AFFILIATES, SUBSIDIARIES, OFFICERS, DIRECTORS, SHAREHOLDERS, MEMBERS, MANAGERS, PARTNERS, AGENTS, EMPLOYEES, CONTRACTORS, REPRESENTATIVES, HEIRS, ASSIGNS, VOLUNTEERS, INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS, EQUIPMENT SUPPLIERS, AND INSURERS OF ALL OF THEM (COLLECTIVELY, PROTECTED PARTIES) FROM AND AGAINST ALL LIABILITIES, LOSSES, DAMAGES, CLAIMS, DEMANDS, ACTIONS, SUITS, CAUSES OF ACTION, COSTS, FEES, AND EXPENSES (INCLUDING REASONABLE ATTORNEY'S FEES AND COURT OR OTHER COSTS) (COLLECTIVELY, CLAIMS) RELATING TO, RESULTING FROM, OR ARISING OUT OF OR ALLEGED TO HAVE ARISEN OUT OF (IN WHOLE OR IN PART) ANY PROPERTY DAMAGE OR BODILY INJURY (INCLUDING DEATH) TO PARTICIPANT RESULTING IN ANY WAY FROM (A) PARTICIPANT'S USE OF THE PREMISES, (B) PARTICIPANT'S ACTIVE OR PASSIVE PARTICIPATION IN THE ACTIVITIES, (C) LOSS OR THEFT OF PERSONAL PROPERTY, (D) FROM THE CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOL AT THE PREMISES BY PARTICIPANT OR ANY OTHER INVITEE**



OF URBAN AIR OR SNAPOLOGY, OR (E) PARTICIPANT'S BREACH OF THIS AGREEMENT. THIS RELEASE AND INDEMNITY SHALL APPLY EVEN IF ANY CLAIM IS CAUSED IN WHOLE OR IN PART BY THE NEGLIGENCE, GROSS NEGLIGENCE, STRICT LIABILITY, OR WILLFUL MISCONDUCT OF THE PROTECTED PARTIES OR PARTICIPANT. THE INDEMNITY SHALL ALSO INCLUDE ADULT PARTICIPANT'S OBLIGATION TO INDEMNIFY THE PROTECTED PARTIES FROM (A) ANY SUM OR SETTLEMENT PAID TO OR ON BEHALF OF THE CHILD PARTICIPANT RESULTING FROM A CLAIM IN ANY WAY INVOLVING THE FOREGOING SUBSECTIONS AND (B) ALL CLAIMS RESULTING FROM OR RELATING TO ANY INSUFFICIENCY OF PARTICIPANT'S LEGAL CAPACITY OR AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE THIS AGREEMENT FOR OR ON BEHALF OF THE CHILD PARTICIPANT.

A. WAIVER OF DAMAGES. TO THE FULLEST EXTENT PERMITTED BY APPLICABLE LAW, THE ADULT PARTICIPANT ON BEHALF OF HIMSELF AND CHILD PARTICIPANT SHALL NOT ASSERT, AND HEREBY WAIVES, ANY CLAIM AGAINST ANY PROTECTED PARTY AND/OR INDEMNITEE, ON ANY THEORY OF LIABILITY, FOR ACTUAL, SPECIAL, INDIRECT, CONSEQUENTIAL, EXEMPLARY OR PUNITIVE DAMAGES ARISING OUT OF, IN CONNECTION WITH, OR AS A RESULT OF, ADULT PARTICIPANT AND/OR CHILD PARTICIPANT'S ENTRY ONTO THE PREMISES AND/OR PARTICIPATION IN ACTIVITIES. NO PROTECTED PARTY AND/OR INDEMNITEE REFERRED IN SECTION 5 ABOVE SHALL BE LIABLE FOR ANY ACTUAL, SPECIAL, INDIRECT, CONSEQUENTIAL, EXEMPLARY OR PUNITIVE DAMAGES ARISING OUT OF, IN CONNECTION WITH, OR AS A RESULT OF, ADULT PARTICIPANT AND/OR CHILD PARTICIPANT'S ENTRY ONTO THE PREMISES AND/OR PARTICIPATION IN ACTIVITIES.

6. DISPUTE RESOLUTION.

A. ARBITRATION. Any dispute or claim arising out of or relating to this Agreement, breach thereof, the Premises, Activities, property damage (real or personal), personal injury (including death), or the scope, arbitrability, or validity of this arbitration agreement (Dispute) shall be brought by the parties in their individual capacity and not as a plaintiff or class member in any purported class or representative capacity, and settled by binding arbitration before a single arbitrator administered by the American Arbitration Association (AAA) per its Commercial Industry Arbitration Rules in effect at the time the demand for arbitration is filed. Judgment on the arbitration award may be entered in any federal or state court having jurisdiction thereof. The arbitrator shall have no authority to award punitive or exemplary damages. If the Dispute cannot be heard by the AAA for any reason, the Dispute shall be heard by an arbitrator mutually selected by the parties. If the parties cannot agree upon an arbitrator, then either party may petition an appropriate court to appoint an arbitrator. Arbitration and the enforcement of any award rendered in the arbitration proceedings shall be subject to and governed by the Federal Arbitration Act, 9 U.S.C. § 1 et seq.

B. WAIVER OF JURY TRIAL. **TO THE EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, ADULT PARTICIPANT ON BEHALF OF HIMSELF/HERSELF AND/OR MINOR PARTICIPANT, SNAPOLOGY, AND URBAN AIR KNOWINGLY, WILLINGLY, AND VOLUNTARILY, WITH FULL AWARENESS OF THE LEGAL CONSEQUENCES, AFTER CONSULTING WITH COUNSEL (OR AFTER HAVING WAIVED THE OPPORTUNITY TO CONSULT WITH COUNSEL) AGREE TO WAIVE THEIR RIGHT TO A JURY TRIAL OF ANY DISPUTE AND TO RESOLVE ANY AND ALL DISPUTES THROUGH ARBITRATION.** The right to a trial by jury is a right parties would or might otherwise have had under the Constitutions of the United States of America and the state in which the Premises is located.

7. **LICENSE.** Participant irrevocably grants the Protected Parties the right to use all or a portion of an image or video of Participant and their name and likeness in all forms and media including composite or modified representations for all purposes, including advertising, trade, or any commercial purpose throughout the world and in perpetuity. **PARTICIPANT WAIVES THE RIGHT TO INSPECT OR APPROVE VERSIONS OF IMAGES OR VIDEOS USED FOR PUBLICATION OR THE WRITTEN COPY THAT MAY BE USED IN CONNECTION WITH THE IMAGES/VIDEOS. PARTICIPANT RELEASES THE PROTECTED PARTIES FROM ANY**



CLAIMS THAT MAY ARISE REGARDING THE USE OF PARTICIPANT'S STATEMENTS, VIDEOS, OR IMAGES INCLUDING ANY CLAIMS OF DEFAMATION, INVASION OF PRIVACY, OR INFRINGEMENT OF MORAL RIGHTS, RIGHTS OF PUBLICITY, OR COPYRIGHT.

8. **AUTHORITY.** If Adult Participant signs this Agreement on behalf of his/her spouse, child, family member, friend, minor child, or other person, Adult Participant warrants and represents to Snapology and Urban Air he/she has the legal authority and such person's actual and implied authority to execute this Agreement on their behalf, including, but not limited to, the arbitration clause, release, indemnity agreement, and license.

9. **ACKNOWLEDGMENTS.** Participant represents to the Protected Parties that this Agreement is a complete and final release and indemnity agreement, that Participant is voluntarily entering into this Agreement, and no representations, promises, or statements made by any of the Protected Parties has influenced Participant in signing this Agreement. Participant agrees that there are no oral agreements, representations, promises, or warranties that are not expressly set forth herein, this Agreement may only be modified in writing, and that Participant is not relying on any statements or representations of the Protected Parties that are not expressly contained herein. Participant expressly agrees that this Agreement is intended to be as broad and inclusive as is permitted by the laws of the state in which the Premises is located and that if any portion thereof is held invalid, it is agreed that the balance shall, notwithstanding, continue in full legal force and effect. Venue for any action brought hereunder or due to Participant's use of the Premises or participation in the Activities shall lie in the County in which the Premises is located. The substantive laws of the state in which the Premises is located shall apply. By signing below, Participant authorizes Snapology and Urban Air to communicate with Participant via email with updates, news, advertisements, and offers.

10. **REPRESENTATIONS BY PARTICIPANT.** Participant represents to the Protected Parties as follows:

- A. Participant shall obey all rules while participating in the Activities and alert the staff of any rule(s) violations or dangerous behavior.
- B. Participant possesses a sufficient level of skill and physical fitness for safe participation in the Activities.
- C. Participant shall only attempt Activities that Participant can perform safely or otherwise engage.
- D. Participant is not aware of any health problems that would prevent him/her from participating in the Activities.
