Caring for Your Luxe Cabinetry

Walnut and White Oak age beautifully with simple, consistent care. Clean with a soft cloth and mild soap, and avoid harsh chemicals or abrasives that can dull the finish. Wipe spills promptly, especially near sinks and appliances, to preserve the wood and its color.

Both species naturally change over time — Walnut deepens, while White Oak develops a warm, gentle patina. These shifts are expected and part of what makes Luxe cabinetry feel warm, lived in, and timeless.

Walnut

As it ages, Walnut naturally develops a soft, warm patina that enriches the wood and enhances its timeless character. It's an excellent choice for homeowners who want cabinetry that feels elevated, grounded, and truly special.

A NOTE ABOUT WALNUT

Walnut is one of the few hardwoods where the heartwood and sapwood contrast can appear naturally within the same piece. This variation is not considered a flaw, it's part of Walnut's charm, adding dimension and authenticity. Over time, Walnut lightens slightly before deepening again into its signature warmth, creating a gentle, lived-in glow that makes spaces feel welcoming and collected.

Walnut also has a naturally soft sheen, even without heavy finishing, which is why it often feels richer and smoother than other hardwoods. Its grain pattern tends to be calm and consistent, making it incredibly versatile in both modern and traditional homes.



ADDITIONAL NOTES

Walnut pairs beautifully with natural stone, plaster, matte metals, and warm flooring. It works well as a full kitchen material or as an accent island to bring visual depth. Because its grain is smooth and understated, Walnut adapts easily to clean, minimal design as well as more detailed, classic cabinetry.

Walnut's natural durability and stability make it suitable for kitchens, offices, bars, mudrooms, and built-ins where longevity and beauty matter. It's also a favorite for homeowners looking for a premium wood that brings warmth without heaviness.

STAINING & FINISHING

Walnut is most often finished in natural or lightly toned colors to preserve its clarity and depth. Its natural beauty is strongest when the finish stays subtle, such as matte and low sheen options, to allow the grain to come forward without distraction.

While Walnut can accept darker stains, most Luxe customers prefer finishes that highlight the wood rather than change it. Light exposure will warm Walnut's tone over time, creating an inviting patina that enhances its luxury feel. This aging process is gentle, predictable, and part of what makes Walnut so beloved.



White Oak

White Oak is a premium hardwood known for its calm, textural grain and soft, organic color tones. Its natural hues range from pale beige to warm taupe, creating cabinetry that feels grounded, balanced, and beautifully understated. White Oak brings quiet movement and subtle variation to a space — enough interest to feel elevated, yet gentle enough to complement a wide range of design styles. Its strength and stability make it a timeless choice for homeowners who want natural elegance paired with long term durability.

A NOTE ABOUT WHITE OAK

White Oak is admired for its ability to adapt to almost any style — from modern Scandinavian to classic transitional. Its grain is tighter and more structured than Red Oak, giving it a clean, architectural presence. Over time, White Oak develops a soft patina that enhances its warmth and texture without dramatically changing its overall look.

One of White Oak's unique qualities is its ability to absorb stain evenly, especially in lighter and neutral tones. This makes it a favorite for natural, matte, and soft beige finishes that highlight the wood's organic beauty.

STANDARD (FLAT-SAWN) WHITE OAK

Standard White Oak features a mix of cathedral grain and straight lines, creating gentle movement across each door and drawer front. This sawn cut offers a warm, approachable look that feels relaxed and natural. It's the most commonly used option and works beautifully in transitional, modern, and classic designs.

QUARTER-SAWN WHITE OAK

Quarter-sawn White Oak produces straighter grain lines with less cathedral patterning, offering a clean, structured appearance. This cut also reveals unique "ray fleck" patterns — subtle, shimmering details considered highly desirable in premium woodworking. Quarter-sawn White Oak is exceptionally stable and often chosen for homeowners who want cabinetry with a refined, tailored look.



STAINING & FINISHING

White Oak accepts stain exceptionally well, especially in natural, matte, and neutral tones that highlight its soft texture. Light finishes keep the look modern and airy, while warmer tones enhance its depth and organic movement.

Because White Oak has a tight, consistent grain, finishes appear clean and even across the cabinetry. Matte and low-sheen options are especially popular in Luxe designs, preserving the wood's natural warmth without adding gloss. Over time, White Oak develops a gentle patina that enhances its character while maintaining its overall color and clarity.
