History of The MacNaughton-Howe Festival

In 1955 Mrs D A MacNaughton from Southampton was working towards supporting cultural activities in Ventnor as she was passionate about keeping the Arts and Crafts alive in the town. Mrs MacNaughton was the daughter of Mr Alfred Scott, and one of 8 children. Alfred came to Ventnor in 1870 and took over the Ironmongers shop where Hurst is now. Members of his family carried it on until the 1960s.

Sadly on February 25th 1956, Mrs MacNaughton died but she did bequeath the sum of £2000 to Ventnor Town Council to be used for cultural activities in the town, and to promote the start of the MacNaughton Festival. Her wish was for the funds to be used for the next 20 years to provide prizes for an annual needlework, handicrafts and horticultural show. The prizes were for the best specimens produced by local residents living within a 5 mile radius of Salisbury Gardens Ventnor. A further £500 legacy was also left to promote community singing or folk dancing for the next 10 years.

When the bequest ended in 1977 there were fears for the future of the MacNaughton Festival, but with the support of many bodies, including the Ventnor Town Council and The Business Association, who undertook to underwrite the financial position, a new group formed and has from then on successfully carried on the tradition of the annual MacNaughton Festival.

One of the original volunteers who worked tirelessly to organise the Festival since its beginnings was Rene Howe. Rene was well known in Ventnor for her support of local community events. In 2001 Mrs Howe died and left a further substantial bequest to the Festival. In her memory the Festival name was changed to the MacNaughton-Howe Festival.

In present times the MacNaughton-Howe Festival is self supporting and no longer receives funding from the Town Council or the Business Association. We are an All Island Event and hold our Annual Show at St Catherine's Church in Ventnor. Although the show has decreased in size over recent years a small but dedicated group of volunteers are determined to put this festival well and truly on the map and build it back to its former glory.

The MacNaughton-Howe Festival - Venue, Rules & Awards

The MacNaughton Howe Arts and Craft Festival is held in St Catherine's Church, Church Street, Ventnor, Isle of Wight. Limited Disabled Parking is available directly outside of the church but there is also The Grove Car park nearby. The church is wheelchair accessible with a ramped entrance. There are also toilets and refreshment facilities inside.

Admission is £1 per adult. Children are free. Competitors and Exhibitors are at the reduced entrance fee of 50 pence per person.

All competitors are requested to read the rules carefully

- All competitions are open to everyone (except those for whom selling art and craft items are their main source of income). For the purpose of this exhibition, which is to further interest in the arts and crafts, in those who mainly follow a particular art or craft as a pastime or hobby
- 2. All competitors are asked to submit their entries either on line or by downloading and printing the entry form from the website or using the form in this printed schedule.
- 3. No competitor to make more than one entry in each class. Entries must be the competitors own work. All competitive entries must have been completed within the last two years and must be unworn or unused. Any competitors names on the entries must be covered.
- 4. Exhibition fees. Adults 8op for each entry. Children free to enter in the children's classes
- 5. All competitors must firmly fix a sealed envelope, or folded sheet of paper, to the exhibit with their name and address inside. The number of the Class should be written on the outside in ink. Children must write their age on their entry. Children's entries must be their own unaided work. Children's prizes must be collected by the child in person, or nominated adult, at the Festival prize giving held 4 PM on the Saturday of the Festival.
- 6. The deadline for entries and fees is 6pm on the Thursday immediately prior to the Festival.
- 7. Prize giving will begin at 4pm on the Saturday of the Festival and no item is to be removed until after the prize giving has finished (normally about 5pm)
- 8. No arrival entered in previous MacNaughton Howe Festivals will be accepted
- 9. Whilst all care will be taken with the exhibits, the committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage arising from any cause whatsoever, or for prizes or exhibits unclaimed at the conclusion of the exhibition.

- 10. Judges will be appointed by the committee and the Judges decisions will be final. Entries not in accordance with the schedule will be disqualified.
- 11. Judging will be on the basis of Gold, Silver, Bronze and Highly Commended. Points will be given for neatness, finish and originality. All awards will be counted towards the MacNaughton-Howe Cups
- 12. Artwork must display the medium used and craft work must display whether a kit has been used.

Awards

- Adults: MacNaughton-Howe Certificates for Gold, Silver, Bronze and Highly Commended
- o Children: Gold £2.00 Silver £1.00. Bronze 50p. Highly Commended.
- Silver Challenge Cups for adults gaining the most marks in the Needlework, Craft, Art, Computer & Photography Sections.
- o Display Cup for non competitive and non profit making displays
- o Rene Howe Award for Best Children's Entry



Non Competitive

- 1. All schools are invited to stage an exhibit to illustrate their work in Art and Craft
- 2. Local Organisations and individual adults are also invited to show their work
- 3. All exhibitors to contact the Show Organisers by the end of August if a display table is required in order that space can be allocated. (limited space is available)
- 4. A display table fee of £15 is payable for each table for groups, clubs and individuals. Tables are to be paid for in advance at the time of booking confirmation
- 5. Competitive entries in the current Festival may be sold, but not removed from display until the end of the Festival. If a competition item is available for sale, please inform the organisers when submitting your entry. A 15% sales commission payable to MacNaughton Howe applies.
