Those who have the Spirit of Christ belong to him and will share his resurrection.



THE SISTERS OF SAINT JOSEPH OF CARONDELET AND OUR MAUI ROSE

“Sister Roselani,” I say, “May I ask you when you got your calling to become a nun?” “Yes, it is crystal clear!” she replies. I was a senior at St. Anthony High School. We had a retreat with a Maryknoll priest by the name of Father Cyril Gumboldt, who spoke to our class about vocations. Toward the end of the day, Father asked this question prior to a time of reflection. “How is God working in your life?” And Dorothy sat up straight and tall. She felt as though this priest were looking straight into her eyes, speaking ONLY to her.

Father Gumboldt offered the students an opportunity to individually chat with him in the rectory after school. As Dorothy knocked at the door, she could hear the booming laughter of the priest, who was a most gregarious man.


Sitting across from each other, Dorothy explained to Father Gumboldt that she had a feeling of uncertainty. “I think I want to get married,” she told him. “I’m not sure.” Father then said, “You can ask God what He wants of you. He will show you the way.” It was soon after that Dorothy went to Holy Rosary Convent to speak to the St. Joseph nuns. They helped her become confident in her calling.

It took five years for Dorothy to complete the formation period. She entered the novitiate and took courses at Mount St. Mary’s University in Los Angeles. Her mom, Annie, surprised her by attending her reception ceremony, during which she received her religious name, a saint’s name. Previously, Dorothy was asked to write down her choice of names. Her first choice was Toshi Anne after Dad and Mom; her second choice was Anne Toshi, for the same reason; and her third choice was Theresa Ellen. Her postulate director, however, questioned her choices. “Toshi is not a saint’s name!” To which Dorothy replied, “It may not be a saint’s name, but my dad is the best Catholic I have ever known!!” The postulate director then asked Dorothy to resubmit other possible names.

During the Mass the presiding Cardinal MacIntyre assigned Dorothy the name she would use for the rest of her life, Sister Roselani Enomoto. After the ceremony, her proud mom said, “You got your Hawaiian name, the flower of Maui... Roselani!” It certainly was significant to receive a name with a strong connection to her home.

During the two hours I visited with her, it was beautiful to feel the humble pride Sister Roselani has carried with her throughout the years as a Sister of Saint Joseph of Carondelet. Her life has been greatly influenced by these women who find so much joy in their lives, even during difficult times. “The Sisters of St. Joseph keep our community viable. They are wonderful role models of living the lives they were called to live.”

At the end of our visit, I placed one of the puakenikeni flowers I had brought for her personal altar in her hair. As we hugged, I realized that Sister Roselani Enomoto’s life has come full circle, from the humble beginnings as a young girl attending Holy Rosary School to the many years as a Sister of St. Joseph of Carondelet and a distinguished educator and citizen of our island, Maui.
