FEAST OF THE VISITATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY (May 31)

Celebrating the Visitation

On May 31, the Church joyfully celebrates the Feast of the Visitation, commemorating Mary's loving visit to her cousin Elizabeth shortly after the Annunciation. Having conceived Jesus by the power of the Holy Spirit, Mary sets out "in haste" to the hill country of Judah, not to seek attention for herself, but to serve, to rejoice, and to share the presence of Christ.

This beautiful mystery invites us to reflect on faith in action. Mary carries Christ to Elizabeth, and in her greeting, John the Baptist leaps for joy in Elizabeth's womb. Even before His birth, Jesus sanctifies and brings joy through the loving service of His mother.

A Meeting Filled with Joy

The Visitation is more than a family reunion. It is a profound encounter between the Old Covenant and the New. Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, proclaims Mary "blessed among women," recognizing her as the Mother of the Lord. Mary responds with the Magnificat, a hymn of praise that glorifies God for His mercy, justice, and faithfulness.

In Mary's song, we hear God's promise of hope for the humble and the lowly. She reminds us that God is always at work, lifting up the poor, filling the hungry with good things, and remaining faithful to His people across generations.

Living the Visitation Today

The Visitation challenges each of us to ask:

- Do I carry Christ to others through my words, actions, and service?
- Do I respond promptly and generously when God calls me to help someone in need?
- Do I rejoice in God's work in my life and in the lives of others?

Like Mary, we are called to be bearers of Christ's presence—bringing compassion, encouragement, and joy to our families, neighbors, and community.

A Simple Prayer

Mary, Mother of Christ and our Mother, teach us to believe God's promises, to serve with humility, and to rejoice always in His goodness. Help us to bring Christ to others with love and haste. Amen.
