At the sight of the crowds, Jesus' heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest." Then he summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits to drive them out and to cure every disease and every illness...

Jesus sent out these twelve after instructing them thus, "Do not go into pagan territory or enter a Samaritan town. Go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons. Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give."

# MY JOURNEY OF FAITH by Peter Fard

I've been attending Holy Rosary for just over a year now, and I truly believe God brought me here. After the Lahaina fires, when I lost my work and became homeless, I reached a point where I had nothing left except my faith. In that moment of complete surrender, God led me to this parish. Holy Rosary became the first place where I felt stability, peace, and a sense of being spiritually held. It wasn't just a church I walked into—it became the place where my faith was rebuilt, where I found community, and where my vocation began to take shape.



My background is very different from where I stand today. I was born into a Muslim family in Iran and later raised in California. Faith was always important to me, but I didn't become Christian until I joined the United States Air Force. During basic training, I experienced God in a way I never had before — a sense of freedom, love, and clarity that I couldn't ignore. I was baptized Protestant during my service, and that moment changed the entire direction of my life.

In my particular family situation, choosing a different faith meant separating from my parents. That was one of the most painful moments of my life, but it also became the moment when I learned to trust God completely. That experience formed my resilience, my identity, and my desire to follow Him wherever He led.

Eventually, I moved to Hawaii — first Oahu and then Maui — after receiving a management promotion to help open Duke's. That opportunity brought me here, and Maui quickly became home. It's where I built my career, my friendships, and eventually my spiritual foundation. Over time, the island became more than a place to live; it became the place where God reshaped my life.

Then the fires happened. Losing everything again — my work, my home, my sense of security — forced me into a deeper dependence on God. In that season of homelessness, I learned what it meant to cling to Him not out of comfort but out of necessity. And in that darkness, He guided me to the Holy Rosary. This parish became a refuge, a place of healing, and the community that held me up when I had nothing left.

This past Easter, I was baptized into the Catholic Church, and it was the best day of my life. It was the moment I truly felt myself drawing closer to God in a way I had been longing for. It wasn't just a ceremony; it was the beginning of a new life, a new identity, and a deeper relationship with Christ. Since then, I've felt myself growing closer to Him every day — through prayer, through the sacraments, and through the life of this parish.

All of these experiences — my upbringing, my conversion in the Air Force, my move to Hawaii, the fires, the homelessness, the healing, and finally my baptism — have shaped who I am today. They've taught me humility, perseverance, and trust in God's providence. And they're the reason I'm here at Holy Rosary, discerning His call with gratitude, hope, and a desire to serve.
