This Father's Day, our parish reflects on the beautiful words of Pope Leo XIV, who recently reminded us that fatherhood is a "wonderful adventure" and a sacred vocation. In moments of deep heartache, he reminds us that the parish community must become a sanctuary of comfort, walking alongside these families with tender prayers and unwavering support.

Ultimately, let us pray for all the men of our parish. May they find strength in St. Joseph's example to lead their families with patience, presence, and unconditional love.
