ENTRUSTING OUR NATION TO CHRIST: CONSECRATING THE USA TO THE SACRED HEART

On June 11, 2026, the U.S. Catholic Bishops formally consecrated the United States of America to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus.

This historic spiritual milestone took place during the USCCB Spring Plenary Assembly. It was carefully timed to precede the nation's upcoming 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence.

Rather than a political statement, the bishops emphasize that this consecration is an act of deep faith and humility. As our country marks its semiquincentennial, the Church invites us to look past division and seek divine healing. Consecrating the nation acknowledges that while America has flaws, it is deeply loved by God and stands in constant need of His mercy.

During the plenary assembly, bishops emphasized that the limitless love of Christ is the ultimate answer to modern cultural anxieties and division. Highlighting this focus, USCCB President Archbishop Paul Coakley noted that the love flowing from Christ's heart "excludes no one" and asked, "Can there be a greater message of hope? Can a greater gift of hope be offered?" Homilists echoed this call for spiritual dependency over political reliance, stating, "Today we choose something better: trust. Today we place the Church in the United States and this nation we love into the Sacred Heart of Jesus."

This powerful act of devotion links our national history with a rich Catholic tradition. The Sacred Heart represents God's boundless, burning love for all humanity. By placing the country under this patronage, the bishops are reminding faithful citizens that true peace, justice, and human flourishing can only be built upon a foundation of divine charity and respect for human dignity.

Furthermore, this consecration serves as a call to spiritual renewal for every individual believer. The bishops note that national healing begins within our own hearts, families, and neighborhoods. Through increased prayer, personal repentance, and an outpouring of acts of mercy, Catholics across the United States are being urged to become living signs of Christ's love in a world that is often fragmented.

We encourage families to pray the official Act of Consecration prayer together at home, asking Jesus to heal our wounds and guide our leaders.
