Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

On that day, Jesus went out of the house and sat down by the sea. Such large crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat down, and the whole crowd stood along the shore. And he spoke to them at length in parables, saying: "A sower went out to sow. And as he sowed, some seed fell on the path, and birds came and ate it up. Some fell on rocky ground, where it had little soil. It sprang up at once because the soil was not deep, and when the sun rose it was scorched, and it withered for lack of roots. Some seed fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked it. But some seed fell on rich soil and produced fruit, a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold. Whoever has ears ought to hear."

JULY: THE MONTH OF THE MOST PRECIOUS BLOOD OF JESUS

Each year, the Catholic Church dedicates the month of July to the Most Precious Blood of Jesus, inviting the faithful to reflect on the immeasurable gift of Christ's sacrifice and the redemption won for humanity through His Blood. This devotion reminds us that our salvation came at a great price—the shedding of the Blood of Jesus on Calvary for the forgiveness of sins and the reconciliation of mankind with God.

Throughout Sacred Scripture, blood is a powerful symbol of life, covenant, and sacrifice. In the Old Testament, the blood of sacrificial offerings was a sign of atonement and covenant with God. These sacrifices foreshadowed the perfect sacrifice of Christ, the Lamb of God, whose Blood was poured out for the salvation of the world. At the Last Supper, Jesus instituted the Holy Eucharist, saying, “This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed on behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins” (Matthew 26:28).

Devotion to the Precious Blood has a rich history in the Church. It gained prominence through centuries of meditation on the Passion of Christ and was especially encouraged by Pope Pius IX, who extended the Feast of the Precious Blood to the Universal Church in 1849. Although the feast was later incorporated into the celebration of Corpus Christi and the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, the Church continues to honor July as the month dedicated to the Precious Blood of Jesus.

The Precious Blood reminds us of the depth of God's love and mercy. Through His suffering, death, and resurrection, Jesus conquered sin and death, opening the way to eternal life.

Every Mass makes present this saving sacrifice, allowing the faithful to participate in the grace won through Christ's Blood. Devotion to the Precious Blood encourages Catholics to deepen their appreciation of the Eucharist, seek reconciliation through the Sacrament of Penance, and extend Christ's love through acts of charity and service.

As we observe this special month, let us renew our gratitude for the sacrifice of Jesus and place our trust in His saving mercy. May contemplation of the Most Precious Blood inspire us to live lives of faith, holiness, and compassion toward others.

Prayer

Most Precious Blood of Jesus, fountain of salvation, strengthen our faith, increase our hope, and inflame our hearts with love. Cleanse us from sin and draw us ever closer to You. Most Precious Blood of Jesus, save us and the whole world. Amen.
