Message from Our Priest

The Grace of the Plenary Indulgence at Christmas

During the Christmas season, the Church, as a loving mother, offers us a great spiritual gift: the **possibility of obtaining a plenary indulgence**, that is, the complete remission of the temporal punishment due for sins whose guilt has already been forgiven in Confession.

This gift is neither automatic nor superficial. It is a grace that presupposes a **truly converted heart**, one that sincerely desires to love God above all things and to break decisively with sin.

What is required to obtain a Plenary Indulgence?

The Church asks us to fulfill **four conditions**, lived with faith and sincerity:

1. **Sacramental Confession**

Approach the Sacrament of Reconciliation with a repentant heart, desiring a new life.

2. **Eucharistic Communion**

Receive Christ in the Eucharist with reverence and love, united with the whole Church.

3. **Prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father**

Pray, for example, one Our Father and one Hail Mary (or another prayer), in communion with the universal Church.

4. **Complete detachment from all sin, even venial**

This condition is essential. It does not mean being perfect, but rather **not clinging voluntarily to any sin**, not excusing it or justifying it. The heart must be sincerely resolved to leave behind everything that separates us from God.

In addition, one must carry out the **indulgenced work**, such as:

- Devout participation in the liturgical celebration of Christmas.
- Eucharistic Adoration.
- Praying the Rosary in family or in community.
- Reading and meditating on Sacred Scripture with faith and recollection.

A Heart That Welcomes the Christ Child

The Child born in Bethlehem does not seek a comfortable heart, but a humble and available one. The plenary indulgence is a concrete invitation to **begin anew**, to allow grace to heal what has not yet been fully purified.

Let us live this Christmas not merely as a tradition, but as a **true opportunity for conversion and interior renewal**. Let us draw near to the sacraments, allow ourselves to be reconciled with God, and receive with gratitude the abundance of His mercy.

“Today a Savior has been born for you” (Lk 2:11).

May He find in us a heart well prepared.
