Pastor's Message

Lent: More Than Ashes, a Journey with Christ

On Wednesday we began Lent, a holy season filled with grace. It is not difficult to see how the forty days Jesus spent in the desert are connected to the forty days the Church gives us each year.

The Church teaches that when we live this season well, we mysteriously share in those days of Jesus — in His fasting, His prayer, and His victory over temptation.

Lent is not simply a symbol or a religious custom. It is a time when Christ Himself is at work in His Church, purifying our hearts and drawing us closer to Him. Our Lenten practices — fasting, prayer, and charity — have power because it is Christ who acts within us.

Ash Wednesday is only the beginning. The ashes are not the goal; they are the doorway. The Lord invites us to walk these forty days with Him.

Dear parents: Lent can transform your home into a true school of faith. Children learn more from what they see than from what they hear. When they see their parents pray, sacrifice, and live their faith, they discover that God is real. Simple practices can teach them deeply:

- Praying together as a family, especially instead of spending more time in front of screens.
- Offering a family sacrifice — giving something up out of love for God.
- Observing Friday abstinence as a visible sign of faith.
- Going to confession together as a family.

These small acts are powerful. They shape children's hearts and give witness to a world that often no longer knows these practices.

More than ever, the world needs to see Christians who live their faith with joy and conviction.

Lent is an opportunity for our families to become visible signs of hope, showing that sacrifice, prayer, and charity do not take life away — they fill it. Christ fasted for forty days, and through His fast He sanctified this season for us. If we walk with Him, these days will not be just another stretch of time, but a season of grace that can renew our lives.
