INVITATION TO PARENTS: THE IMPORTANCE OF CATHOLIC CATECHESIS IN THE FAITH FORMATION OF THEIR CHILDREN. Faith Formation 2

Sowing Today to Harvest Tomorrow

Catechesis is a seed that, over time, bears abundant fruit. The lessons learned in childhood are forever engraved in the heart. A child formed in the values of the Gospel will be an adult capable of seeking the common good, of showing solidarity with those most in need, and of facing life with hope.

In catechesis, we learn that each person is unique and loved, that life is a gift, that forgiveness is possible, and that the community is a safe space for growth and sharing. These truths, when integrated into daily life, transform families and the entire society.

The Accompaniment of Mothers, Fathers, and Caregivers

The role of mothers, fathers, and caregivers in the catechesis process is fundamental. It is not just about taking children to the parish or catechetical center but about accompanying them on their faith journey. Participating in celebrations, praying as a family, and discussing what they have learned in catechism are valuable ways to show interest and commitment.

Furthermore, the testimony of the family is the best example children can receive. When they see adults practicing the faith with joy and consistency, striving to live according to Christian values and seeking the good of those around them, children find a real motivation to continue that path.

A Space for Growth and Sharing

Catechism is also a space for encounter and friendship. In it, children meet other people their age, share concerns, joys, and doubts. They learn together that faith is an adventure experienced in community. This sense of belonging and mutual support is especially important in a world where competition and individualism often prevail.
