Pastor's Message

Entering the Mystery of the Mass

Why Do We Come to Mass?

When you ask a child why he goes to school, he will probably answer, *"Because I have to."*

Many adults would give a similar answer if asked why they come to Mass.

"Because it's an obligation."

And that is true.

But it is not the deepest reason.

We come to Mass because **the Risen Christ invites us to encounter Him.**

Every Sunday, God gathers us as His family to speak to us through His Word, to nourish us with the Body and Blood of His Son, and to send us back into the world with a mission.

The Mass does not begin when the priest walks to the altar. It begins much earlier, when God places within our hearts the desire to come.

That is why we are not here to watch something happen, nor simply to fulfill a religious obligation.

We come to participate in the greatest mystery of our faith.

The **Second Vatican Council** reminded us that every member of the faithful is called to a **full, conscious, and active participation** in the liturgy. This participation is much more than simply doing something outwardly. It means opening our hearts and uniting our lives with Christ's offering to the Father.

Every prayer, every reading, every hymn, every moment of silence, and every response has a purpose. Nothing in the liturgy is accidental.

Over the next several weeks, we will discover together the beauty of each part of the Mass. We will reflect on why we respond, why we sing, why silence is important, why we stand, sit, and kneel, and how we prepare ourselves to receive Holy Communion.

My hope as your pastor is very simple: **to help you discover the beauty of the Mass**, so that each Sunday becomes more than a habit—it becomes a true encounter with Jesus Christ.

This week, I invite every family to reflect on one simple question:

When I come to Mass, am I here only because I have to be, or because I truly desire to meet the Lord?

The Mass is not something we simply attend; it is a mystery into which Christ invites us.
