Message from our Pastor:

"Plenary Indulgence: A Gift of God's Mercy"

As November begins, the Church invites us to look toward heaven with hope and to pray for all the faithful departed. During these days, we are offered a great spiritual gift: the plenary indulgence, an act of mercy for the souls of our loved ones.

An indulgence is the remission, before God, of the temporal punishment due to sins that have already been forgiven. It is an expression of God's mercy through the Church, applying the merits of Christ and the saints to the faithful. Pope Francis has called the indulgence a "hug of mercy" that reconciles us with God and renews our trust in His forgiveness.

From November 1st to 8th, the faithful who visit a cemetery and pray for the departed —even silently— may obtain a plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory. It may also be gained on November 2nd, All Souls' Day, by visiting a church or oratory and praying the Our Father and the Creed.

The usual conditions to obtain a plenary indulgence are:

1. Sacramental confession (within several days before or after).
2. Reception of Holy Communion.
3. Prayer for the Pope's intentions.
4. Complete detachment from sin, even venial sin.

These conditions show a sincere desire for conversion and union with God. If one condition is lacking, the indulgence becomes partial — but it remains a beautiful act of grace.

The indulgence is not "automatic"; it is an act of faith, humility, and love. Offering it for the deceased is a spiritual work of mercy that strengthens our communion with them.

Other occasions to receive a plenary indulgence include praying the Rosary with others, spending at least half an hour in Eucharistic adoration, or receiving the papal blessing *Urbi et Orbi*.
