Message from our Pastor:

October: Month of the Holy Rosary

“The Rosary: A Path of Contemplation with Mary”

Already in the 19th century, Pope Leo XIII dedicated the month of October to the **Holy Rosary**, encouraging all the faithful to pray it with confidence. Since then, the Church has lived this month as a special time to join Mary in contemplating the mysteries of Christ's life.

Saint John Paul II, in his Apostolic Letter *Rosarium Virginis Mariae* (2002), reminds us that the Rosary is not just about repeating words, but about **looking upon the face of Christ with the eyes of Mary**:

“To look upon the face of Christ, to recognize its mystery in His daily life and sufferings, and then to grasp the divine splendor revealed in the Risen Lord seated at the Father's right hand—this is the task of every disciple of Christ.”

In *The Contemplative Rosary*, Dan Burke and Connie Rossini explain that meditation begins with pondering the mysteries, but it does not end there: it leads us to **stand in awe before the grandeur of God's desire for union with us**. The Rosary is about worship, drawing our hearts to bow in adoration before the Triune God whom the Rosary reveals.

Praying the Rosary is not an escape from life, but a way to see our lives through God's eyes. Each Hail Mary is like a rose offered to Mary, and with her we bring our joys, struggles, and hopes before the Lord.

This month's invitation:

- Pray one mystery a day with your family.
- Contemplate Christ with Mary and allow His light into your life.
- Discover in the Rosary not just repetition, but a path of adoration and trust.
