Pastor's Message

Stewardship - 1

What is Stewardship? Everything is God's gift

During this Easter season, as we celebrate that Christ is risen and has given us new life, we want to reflect as a parish on an important aspect of Christian living: **Stewardship**.

Stewardship means recognizing that **everything we have comes from God**, and that we are called to use these gifts with love and responsibility.

Sacred Scripture tells us:

"As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace." (1 Peter 4:10).

Being Christian does not only mean believing in God; it also means recognizing that our life is a gift.

Our faith, our family, our time, our abilities, and even our material resources are gifts entrusted to us by God.

Stewardship reminds us that:

- We receive God's gifts with gratitude
- We care for them responsibly
- We share them generously
- And we return them to God with love

We are not absolute owners of what we have; we are **stewards of God's gifts**.

Stewardship is not a campaign or simply about giving money. It is a way of living as disciples of Jesus.

A disciple recognizes God as the source of all good and desires to respond with love. Stewardship has the power to shape the way we see our lives: everything becomes an opportunity to love and serve.

This week, as a family, we can ask:
