Pastor's Message

Entering into the Mystery of the Mass V

The Great Amen: May Our Lives Respond to God

Throughout this summer, we have been entering, little by little, into the mystery of the Mass.

We have discovered that Christ gathers us, that silence teaches us to listen, that faith prepares our hearts, and that God makes us one people who respond with one voice.

Today we come to one of the most important responses of the entire Mass: **Amen**.

At the end of the Eucharistic Prayer, the priest raises the Body and Blood of Christ and proclaims:

"Through him, and with him, and in him..."

And the whole Church responds: **"Amen."**

This is not simply a word that tells us the prayer has ended. It is a response of faith.

With our Amen, we say:

Yes, Lord, I believe.

Yes, Lord, I unite myself to Christ.

Yes, Lord, I want to offer You my life as well.

Everything we have reflected on during these past weeks seems to lead us to this moment. God speaks, and we listen. God reveals Himself, and we believe. God gathers us, and we respond as one people.

And now, united with Christ, our voices become one word: **Amen**.

But our Amen cannot end when the Mass ends.

The Amen we pronounce with our lips is meant to become the Amen we live each day: in our families, in our work, when we serve, when we forgive, when loving is difficult, and when God calls us to trust even when we do not understand everything.

So, the next time we come to this moment in the Mass, let us not respond "Amen" simply out of habit.

Pause interiorly and ask yourself:

What am I offering to God together with Christ?

And then respond with the whole Church: **AMEN**.

May our Amen not end in the church.

May our whole life become an Amen to God.

Because the Mass is not something we simply attend; it is a mystery into which Christ invites us to enter.
