

How does my daughter earn a Badge/Service Star?

Our troop works hard to complete a badge from each frontier every year so that at the end of the year, your daughter has a full honeycomb on her uniform. No extra work at home is necessary. However, AHG does leave an option for a girl to work on extra badges at home. To accommodate this option, we have set up a form to let your daughter's leader know what badge she has completed at home with your supervision.



To keep the integrity of the badge, we also schedule a “Show and Tell” night on the troop calendar. This is the night your child must be ready to present to her unit the badge she has earned at home. See below for details.

How to fill our front side of this form:

1. *Understand the Badge/Service Star requirements for each level.*

	Badge	Service Star
Tenderheart	<i>Earn all requirements under the “complete all” heading plus one under the “complete one” heading</i>	<i>Will receive one blue star for every 5 hours of service. Service does not count towards family members or paid service.</i>
Explorer	<i>Earn all requirements under the “complete all” heading plus two under the “complete two” heading</i>	<i>Will receive one red star for every 10 hours of service. Service does not count towards family members or paid service.</i>
Pi/Pa	<i>Earn all requirements under the “complete all” heading plus three under the “complete three” heading</i>	<i>Will receive one white/yellow star for every 15/20 hours of service. Service does not count towards family members or paid service.</i>

2. *Have a parent fill out the Badge/Service Star Completion form and sign that the work has been completed . Turn in on Show and Tell Night. See troop calendar for this year’s date.*

3. *Show and Tell Night.* To keep the integrity of the badge, if your daughter has earned a badge on her own, outside of troop meetings, she will need to show her class what she worked on at home with a physical presentation. This could be as simple as sharing a project that she made to earn the badge with pictures of her working on the badge, making an informational poster, slideshow, etc. After she has shared with her unit, her Unit Leader will sign off on the form and update her online info.

4. *Payment.* The troop pays for badges earned in meetings from our troop budget. Any extra badges completed at home, please send \$4 to cover the cost.
