Statement of Faith

The Bible

We believe that the Bible is the Word of God, written by Divinely inspired men. We believe that it is complete and inerrant in the original writings and is the supreme and final authority in faith and life. (2 Tim 3:16,17; 2 Peter 1:19-21; Psalm 119:11; Prov 30:5-6; 1 Peter 1:23-25)

\mathcal{G}_{od}

We believe that there is one, and only one, living and true God, eternally existing in three persons; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. God alone is holy and worthy of praise and honor and glory and power forever and ever.

(Matt 28:19; 1 Cor 8:6; Rev 5:13)

Jesus Christ

We believe that Jesus Christ, begotten of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary, is God the son, manifest in the flesh, yet sinless. We believe that in Him dwells all the fullness of the Godhead. (Matt 1:18-25; Phil 2:6-8; Col 2:9; John 1:14)

We believe that He bodily arose from the dead, ascended to Heaven, and is present there as the High Priest, Intercessor, and Advocate for all believers. (Luke 24:26;

Heb 7:24-25; I John 2:1; Heb 2:17; I Tim. 2:5)

We believe that in His second coming, Jesus Christ will come personally, bodily and visibly to set up His kingdom on earth and to judge the world in righteousness.

(I Thess. 4:13-18; Rev. 20:4-6; Acts 10:42)

Sin

We believe that man was created in the image of God, but sinned and incurred not only physical death but also spiritual death, which is separation from God. We believe that all mankind is born with a sinful nature and in need of a Savior. (Gen. 1:26,27; Rom. 3:10,23; 5:12; Isa. 53:6)

Salvation

We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ died a substitutionary death upon the cross. His sacrifice made atonement for the sin of the world, that all might be justified by His shed blood. (I Cor 15:3,4; Eph 1:7; Rom 5:9)

We believe that all those, and only those, who believe in Him, who trust in His shed blood, and by faith receive Him as Lord and Savior, have eternal life in Him. We believe that those who receive the Lord Jesus Christ are born into the family of God and are sealed in Christ with the Holy Spirit. (I John 5:11-13; John 3:15; Heb 10:19;

Eph 2:8-9; John 1:12; John 3:5; Eph 1:13; 2 Cor 1:21,22)

Floly Spirit

We believe that the Holy Spirit indwells all Believers in the Lord Jesus Christ, baptizing them into the body of Christ. (1 Cor 6:19; 1 Cor 12:13; Rom 8:9,14)

We believe that for the Believer, the Holy Spirit gives spiritual understanding, comfort, life, and produces the fruit of the Spirit and power for service. (John 14:26;

Acts 1:8; Rom 8:11; 1 John 4:16; Gal 5:22)

We believe that the Holy Spirit convicts and reproves the world of sin and of righteousness and of judgment. (John 16:8-11)



We believe that the Church is the body of Christ, composed of all born-again believers (Eph. 1:3-6; I Cor. 12:12-14) We believe that the primary mission of the Church is to witness concerning the Head, Jesus Christ and to "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded..."

(Matt. 28:19-20)

Satan

We believe that Satan is a real, personal being. We believe that he is the enemy of God, the "father of lies", the "great deceiver" and the instigator of all false systems of religion. We believe he is a being of great cunning, able to exert great power but only so far as God allows.

(Eph. 6:11; I Peter 5:8)

We believe he and all his followers shall ultimately be cast into the lake of fire forever and ever.

(Rev. 20:10, 14, 15)

Final State

We believe in the bodily resurrection of both the saved and the lost; for the saved, everlasting blessedness in the presence of God and for the lost, everlasting punishment and separation from God. (John 3:16-18; Rom. 6:23)

Doctrine

We believe that the above points of doctrine are Biblical truths and lead to salvation, true faith and godliness. (I John 4:2,3; Phil. 1:27; I John 5:1-8)

The statements listed above define the very basic Christian beliefs necessary for true fellowship in any Christian church. And although they do not encompass all scriptural thoughts and beliefs, they do define a common ground for study and pursuit of greater understanding of the Word of God. There are, however, other issues and beliefs that have been deliberated and debated for centuries and that have led to strife and division in the Church, rather than to love and unity. We support and encourage each to be fully convinced in their own conscience about such issues, but ask that they not be held dogmatically to the point of division and separation.

Salvation Topic Scripture References

Because we believe that the primary mission of the church is to witness concerning the head, Jesus Christ, it is each believer's privilege and responsibility to share that Good News.
