Charleston And Beckwith Lead In Batting And Home Runs

Philadelphia.—According to the batting averages of players in the Eastern League for the 1925 season, Oscar Charleston, manager of the Harrisburg Giants leads the heavy clouters with an average of 430. John Beckwith, of the Baltimore Black Sox is a close second, with 419.

"Babe Ruth" Wilson, Sox first baseman, with 400, gives the Sox the distinction of the only club having two hitters in the 400 class. "Heavy" Johnson and George Britt are the only other Sox players in the 300 division.

Hilldale has 9 in the 300 class; Harrisburg, 9; Bacharach's, 4; Lincoln Giants, 4; Brooklyn Royals, 4; Black Sox, 4; Cuban Stars, 3.

Charleston leads in home run honors by clouting out 14; Beckwith is again a close second with 13, while Walter Cannady, of the Harrisburg team, holds down third position with 12 circuit clouts.

The Commissioners of the Eastern League will meet at the Christian Street Y. M. C. A. building, Saturday. The league moguls will wind up the business of the past season and consider a balanced circuit and improved conditions for 1926.

Charleston Leads Eastern League Batters

Babe Ruth Wilson Is 8 Points Behind; 9 Sox Are In The 300 Class

Apparently the managerial duties are resting lightly upon the shoulders of Oscar Charleston, manager of the Harrisburg Giants, who at the present time are topping the list in the Eastern circuit.

Aside from keeping his club up in the running, the doughty field leader of Colonel Strothers' Law Makers, has clouted the combined offerings of the league hurlers for a 455 mark that stands out like a beacon light for the rest of the players to shoot at. In addition hustling Oscar has driven out six home runs and is only topped by his team mate, Walter Cannady, who is showing the way in distance hitting, with eighth homers to his credit. Charleston, is also second in base thefts having stolen nine sacks, running closely behind George Carr of the Hilldale team, who has stolen 14 bases.

Another material aid to the fast traveling Harrisburg team is Jack Shackelford, the sensational young third baseman, who hails from Wiley College, Texas. Shackelford has horned into the select class of 400 hitters and has hit safely in all but two games since joining the Harrisburg team.

Glentanner, of Harrisburg, with five wins and no defeats is the leading pitcher. Corbett of Harrisburg and Rector and Hubbard of the Royal Giants, also have clean slates with three, four and two respective victories.
