The "league was organized in 1906 by William Freihofer who owned of the Philadelphia Professionals baseball club. Originally the league was to include one white team, two black teams and two Cuban teams. The original teams that started the season were:

The Cuban Stars and Quaker Giants dropped of the "league" in July and were replaced by the Philadelphia Giants and Wilmington Giants.

The Philadelphia Giants won the title at the end of the season and were awarded the Freihofer Cup which was given to the "league" championship team.
