

In the meantime, we continue to hope and pray and work hard. You never know what effort or what connection might lead to success. Even with all the networks and systems at the committee's disposal sometimes it might be something like word of mouth that brings the right person to us.

We will have several guest preachers this Summer and if they each experience Honey Brook Presbyterian at its best, with a full congregation and the joy that I have experienced from worshipping with you, then, who knows, word just might get out that this is a great place for a pastor looking for a special congregation with growth potential.

As I look forward to an enjoyable Summer, I also look forward to the weeks that I will be with you. May God bless us and keep us all safe and bless the work of the PNC.

Even though Elli and Olivia don't like to eat fruit, they enjoyed learning about the Fruit of the Spirit.







committee is attempting to raise for this year's care of the cemetery grounds. With funds pledged and your help we believe we will accomplish our goal.


ONLINE CHURCH DIRECTORY
