

DO I NEED A WILL?

A will is a powerful tool for ensuring your final wishes are honored and that your loved ones are protected during a difficult time. It allows you to make charitable donations, support causes you care about, and ensure your values are reflected in the distribution of your estate.

Many people want to leave a positive impact on the world after they pass. And a great way to do this is to support the charities or causes you love most. When you write a will, you can preserve your legacy by leaving a part of your estate to a charitable organization.

In Pennsylvania, if you die without a will, your property will be distributed according to state "intestacy" laws. Pennsylvania's intestacy law gives your property to your closest relatives, beginning with your spouse and children. If you have neither a spouse nor children, your grandchildren or your parents will get your property. This list continues with increasingly distant relatives, including siblings, grandparents, aunts and uncles, cousins, nieces and nephews. If the court exhausts this list to find that you have no living relatives by blood or marriage, the state will take your property.

In Pennsylvania, in addition to a will, there are other important estate planning documents to consider:

- Power of Attorney. A power of attorney allows you to appoint an agent to handle your financial matters, such as
 paying bills, handling real estate transactions, or managing bank accounts if you are unable. Your agent has a fiduciary duty to act in your best interest.
- Health Care Directive. A health care directive or living will allows you to leave instructions for your end-of-life care. It also lets you name someone to get your health information and make medical decisions on your behalf when you can't, for example, if you are injured and can't speak or are in a coma.

These documents can help you and your loved ones during your lifetime, while a will helps your family and loved ones when you pass.
