### **OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD**



The Holidays are approaching! Operation Christmas Child will be the mission focus in October. Operation Christmas Child, a project of Samaritan's Purse, collects and delivers gift-filled shoeboxes to children in over 170 countries, aiming to share the message of Jesus Christ and bring joy to children who might not otherwise receive gifts.

To get the best bargains possible, Chris Martin has been shopping year-round for the best price points on the items for the boxes. After Christmas sales, back to school, end of summer clearance, and Wal-Mart discount aisles, have all been a great place to find the items needed! With inflation, The Dollar Tree is now pricing most items at \$1.75, but Chris has found many items under \$1 to make up for

the increase on the items not on sale. We have 25 boxes left from last year, as she ordered for two years to save on the shipping. All that is left to do is pack, ship, and pray for the children who will be receiving the boxes.

Boxes will be packed during Sunday School on October 26, as the national collection starts on November 17th. Chris will deliver the boxes to the shipping hub in the following days.

Shipping has increased to \$10/box. We have 25 boxes again this year, so our goal is to collect \$250 to cover the shipping. **Donations can be made through the month of October.** A box for donations can be found in the Fellowship Hall.

Thank you for your continued support with this outreach project and a special thank you to Chris Martin for her leadership with this ministry to children!
