## ATTENTION MOTORBOAT RENTERS

## OPERATORS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR KNOWING ALL BOATING LAWS AND REGULATIONS.

## IMPORTANT BOATING REGULATIONS AND TIPS FOR OPERATION

- LIFE JACKETS. An approved wearable life jacket must be on board for each person. On boats 20 feet in length or less, children 12 years and younger must wear one at all times while the boat is underway (this includes drifting).
- LOOK AROUND! Most boating accidents involve collisions between boats or between a boat and a fixed object (like a bridge pier). Avoid accidents by being aware of everything going on around you. This is called "keeping a PROPER LOOKOUT."
- WATCH YOUR WAKE! A wake is the wave that follows your boat while you are operating it. You must travel at a SLOW NO WAKE speed within 100 FEET of the shoreline, unpowered boats, docks, downed skiers, swimmers, and anchored, moored, or drifting boats.
- YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE for your actions on the water. RECKLESS OPERATION is illegal and dangerous. Travel a safe speed so your ability to maneuver and stop is never in doubt. Any damage you cause (even from your wake) is your responsibility.
- DRINKING AND BOATING DON'T MIX! It is illegal to operate any boat while under the influence of ALCOHOL or a controlled substance. PENALTIES include fines up to \$5,000, 90 days imprisonment, and loss of boating privileges.
- When APPROACHING another boat HEAD ON, TURN TO THE RIGHT.
- When OVERTAKING another boat, you may pass on either side.
   The boat being overtaken must maintain its course and speed.
- In a CROSSING situation, the boat to your right has the right-ofway and should maintain course and speed. You should change course, slow down, and pass behind the boat on the right. You have the right of way over boats on your left, BUT NEVER INSIST ON THE RIGHT-OF-WAY. WHEN IN DOUBT, GIVE-WAY.
- NIGHT OPERATION. All boats must show the required running LIGHTS between sunset and sunrise and during periods of restricted visibility. When at ANCHOR, all boats, regardless of length, must display an all-around white light between sunset and sunrise and during periods of restricted visibility.
- SOUND-PRODUCING DEVICE. Boats less than 40 feet in length must carry some mechanical means of making a sound signal audible for a half-mile. The sound may be generated by hand, mouth, or power, and the device must be readily accessible to the boat operator or passengers.
- STAY AWAY FROM DAMS. The downstream side is just as dangerous as the upstream side. Don't get sucked in by the downstream side's safe appearance.
- Become familiar with the boat by testing the turning radius and stopping distance. Remember, BOATS DO NOT HAVE BRAKES.
- STAY AWAY from unpowered boats and large commercial craft.
- Courtesy toward others on the water and to people on shore is very important. Have fun, but don't ruin someone else's day.
- BAD WEATHER CAN KILL BOATERS. If a storm is near, head for shore or a safe harbor.
