NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON TAX INCREASE

A tax rate of .06 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of Johnson County Emergency Service District 1.

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2020 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for Johnson County Emergency Service District 1 from the same properties in both the 2019 tax year and the 2020 tax year.

The voter-approval tax rate is the highest tax rate that Johnson County Emergency Service District 1 may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate, unless the de minimis rate for Johnson County Emergency Service District 1 exceeds the voter-approval tax rate for Johnson County Emergency Service District 1.

The de minimis rate is the rate equal to the sum of the no-new-revenue maintenance and operations rate for Johnson County Emergency Service District 1, the rate that will raise \$500,000, and the current debt rate for Johnson County Emergency Service District 1.

The proposed tax rate is greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that Johnson County Emergency Service District 1 is proposing to increase property taxes for the 2020 tax year.

A public hearing on the proposed tax rate will be held on September 17, 2020 at 7:00 PM at the Johnson County Emergency Services District No. 1 Training Center R.C. McFall Complex Board Room 2451 Service Drive Cleburne TX.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, Johnson County Emergency Service District 1 is not required to hold an election at which voters may accept or reject the proposed tax rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of the Johnson County Emergency Service District 1 at their offices or by attending the public meeting mentioned above.
