We are delighted to announce that the Prince's Countryside Fund have been appointed by Defra as a provider to the **Future Farming Resilience Fund (FFRF) Scale Up Project**. The Exmoor Hill Farming Network will deliver this project across the Greater Exmoor area working with 13 other networks across the country including Farm Cornwall and Dartmoor. This project will provide a wealth of information, workshops and free business support as we move through the agricultural transition and will run between September 2022 to March 2025. Further information will become available shortly with project sign up commencing from September 2022.

Join us for an informative farm tour and talk with Gerald, Fonda and Jack Buckingham at the family farm near Brompton Regis. Jack works part time on the farm alongside his parents and part time as a Farm Business Consultant with Creedy Associates Ltd. The farm is part way through significant changes to both the sheep and cattle enterprises alongside the expansion of both enterprises. The sheep enterprise currently consists of 430 breeding ewes which are transitioning from Texel x and Suffolk x to include NZ Romney, Aberfield, Lleyns and mules with the aim of increasing lambs reared and switching from indoor to outdoor lambing. The suckler herd of 35 cows are Devon x, Angus x and Hereford x dairy put to Limousin with calves sold at 8-9 months old. Root crops for outwintering have recently been reintroduced along with more extensive reseeding and rotational grazing. Booking is essential for catering purposes - admin@ehfn.co.uk

NSA Samuel Wharry Memorial Award -Travel Bursaries



The National Sheep Association (NSA) is excited to open applications as the search begins for the second pair of lucky recipients for the NSA Samuel Wharry Memorial Award for the Next Generation. The award, given in association with the Company of the Merchant of the Staple of England, comes in the form of two generous £2,750 travel bursaries to support two young people, aged 21 to 34, in a study trip to explore the application of science in sheep production. It gives enthusiastic and aspirational young sheep farmers the opportunity to widen their shepherding knowledge and experience. The awards are made in memory of Samuel Wharry of Carnlough, County Antrim, who was NSA Chairman when he died suddenly in May 2017, aged just 56. Samuel was an advocate of science and technology, particularly relating to genetics, during his many years breeding Blackface sheep.

Applicants are invited to apply for the bursary online on the NSA Next Generation website where they will be asked about their current involvement in the sheep sector, their plans for the future and for an outline of a planned study trip. The purpose of the study trip must be to learn more about the practical application of science and technology in the sheep sector. The recipients of the award will be expected to share findings from their trip through NSA communications. Recipients of the first award, Marie Prebble, a sheep farmer and shearer from Kent, and Charlie Beaty, a mixed farmer from Warwickshire, received their bursaries at the beginning of 2019, allowing plans to be



made for study trips exploring different aspects of sheep production. Marie chose to travel to France, Norway, Iceland and parts of the UK, using her bursary to investigate best practice at shearing time, both improving animal welfare and wool presentation, whilst Charlie travelled to the Southern hemisphere visiting New Zealand to investigate grassland management and how improvement and utilisation of permanent pasture can be used to reduce production costs. Applications are now open until **Monday 12**th **September** with first interviews due to be held on Monday 3rd October.
